World War II Chaplain Hero, Father Thomas Conway Posthumously Awarded Navy Cross

Catholic Priest cited for giving his all in support of shipmates thrown overboard after 1945 sinking of the USS Indianapolis (CA-35)

WATERBURY, CT – Father Thomas Conway, CHC, LT, USN, a diocesan priest of Buffalo, NY, was awarded the Navy Cross posthumously on Friday in his hometown of Waterbury, CT. The Navy Cross is the second-highest military decoration in both the United States Navy and the U.S. Marine Corps. The medal is awarded to Sailors or Marines who distinguish themselves for extraordinary heroism in combat with an armed enemy force.
