Secretary - Jackie Pearson – Presented minutes from the November, 2016 meeting for approval as printed in the last newsletter. The motion was seconded and passed. There were no corrections.

Treasurer Jean Odom- Jean stated we had approx. \$6,500.00 and that the dues are now due and the balance will increase. There was a correction in the finances in the newsletter in that the Fall Retreat funds were for 2016 not 2017.

If the schools in the county were the guild representatives live are closed on the TVQA meeting date due to weather conditions, or if you county is under a severe weather warning, then your guild will be excused from attendance for that meeting.

If you will not be at the TVQA meeting due to severe weather, contact the TVQA President, Vice President or Secretary either the night before the meeting or before 9:00 a.m. the day of the meeting.

(Note: I need someone to provide me the guidelines of this challenge so I can communicate them - Elaine)




