**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION – HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION PROVIDING A 25 DAY GRACE PERIOD FOR 2012 THIRD QUARTER DUE DATE**

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-64 requires that municipal tax bills be mailed forty-seven (47) days before the third installment of taxes falls on August 1<sup>st</sup>, namely on June 14<sup>th</sup>; and

WHEREAS, the Sussex County Board of Taxation has not as of this date certified the 2012 tax rates for municipalities in Sussex County;

WHEREAS, the date of mailing of Hampton Township tax bills to Hampton Township taxpayers cannot be determined at this time; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the intent of N.J.S.A. 54:4-64 invoking any payment of interest for delinquency under the provisions of N.J.S.A. 54:4-64; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 54:4-67 deems twenty five (25) days after proper mailing of said tax bills and certification of such mailing, to be adequate notice of the amount of taxes due.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Hampton, in the County of Sussex, State of New Jersey as follows:

Hampton Township taxes or assessments due August 1, 2012 will not be considered delinquent and interest for delinquency in the payment of such taxes and assessments shall not be charged for the failure to pay any such taxes or assessments if received by the Township on or before the twenty fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) day after the proper mailing of the tax bills and provided further, however, that if any such installment is not paid on or before said twenty fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) day, interest at the usual rate will be charged from August 1, 2012.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **DELTA DENTAL – RENEWAL PREMIUMS AGREEMENT – 24 MONTH RATES – NO INCREASE FROM CURRENT RATES**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to authorize the renewal of an Employee Dental Program Agreement between Hampton Township and Delta Dental Insurance from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014, with no increase from current rates.

#### **HAROLD E. PELLOW & ASSOCIATES, INC. –IKE WILLIAMS ROADWAY REPAIRS RELATING TO HURRICANE IRENE AND NJDEP PERMITS**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to allocate funds in the amount of approximately \$4,500 for Township Engineer H. Pellow to prepare the necessary plans and applications for NJDEP Permits associated with repairs made to Ike Williams Road as a result of Hurricane Irene in FY 2012, and in addition, authorize funds in the amount of \$1,600 to the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey for application fees associated with repairs to Ike Williams Road.

#### **HAMPTON TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS – ESTIMATE FOR THE TOWNSHIP TO INSTALL THE NECESSARY DRAINAGE ON HAGGERTY ROAD - \$5,525.00**

The Township Committee reviewed a request from Township DPW Manager D. Bayles to purchase equipment and supplies in the amount of \$5,525 for the installation of 2 catch basins and 220 ft. of pipe to resolve a drainage issue on Haggerty Road in Hampton Township. In his letter, DPW Manger D. Bayles explained that he has received several complaints from residents who live in the affected area. The Township Committee agreed by full consensus that the project should be done to avoid icing issues during the winter months.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to authorize the purchase of equipment and supplies in the amount of \$5,525 for the installation of 2 catch basins and 220 ft. of pipe on Haggerty Road to alleviate an existing drainage issue.

**SYLVIA ZIKA – COMPLAINT REGARDING LOWE'S PROPERTY MAINTENANCE**

Township Administrator E. Kloose stated that Township Building Inspector J. deJager inspected a parcel of property owned by Lowe's Home Improvement Center in Hampton Township on State Highway Route 206, which is adjacent to Dr. Sylvia Zika's property. The inspection was conducted in response to Dr. Zika's complaint that Lowe's is not maintaining the lot in accordance with requirements set forth by Hampton Township's Codes relating to Commercial Property Maintenance, Brush, Grass & Weed, and Soil Removal. Inspector J. deJager reported that Lowe's is indeed complying with all the Codes referenced by Dr. Zika. Administrator E. Kloose noted that the State of New Jersey owns a small triangular right-of-way adjacent to Dr. Zika's property, however, it is not within the township's jurisdiction.

The Township Committee expressed concern that Dr. Zika has not closed off access to her driveway entrance located on Route 206 North, as required by Township Resolution. For safety reasons, township officials had instructed Dr. Zika to comply with site plan terms by closing off access to the driveway. Township Administrator E. Kloose stated that she would send Dr. Zika a letter responding to her property maintenance complaints about Lowe's Home Center. In addition, the letter will serve to reiterate Dr. Zika's obligation to comply with site plan requirements to close off access to her driveway entrance located on State Highway Route 206 North.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Kloose to send Dr. Zika a letter outlining the Township Committee's response to Dr. Zika's letter dated June 4, 2012 regarding the matter referenced above, and in addition, the letter will serve to remind Dr. Zika of her obligation to close off access to her driveway entrance located on State Highway Route 206 North.

**EPILEPSY FOUNDATION OF NJ – APPROVAL REQUESTED FOR A BIKE, RUN, AND WALK TO BEAT EPILEPSY, SHAWN DANESI MEMORIAL RIDE – OCTOBER 14, 2012, 10:00 AM TO 2:00 PM**

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to approve a request from the Epilepsy Foundation of New Jersey to hold a Bike, Run, Walk to Beat Epilepsy, Shawn Danesi Memorial Ride Event on October 14, 2012 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

**LETTER FROM MS. J. HUIZENGA RE: SUSSEX COUNTY MALL TRAFFIC AND LANE STACKING**

The Township Committee reviewed a letter from Ms. Janice Huzzennga regarding traffic stacking at the traffic light located at the entrance of the Sussex County Mall on Route 206. In her letter, Ms. Huzzennga expressed concern that the signal light located at the intersection of Route 206 and the access road within the Sussex County Mall cannot adequately accommodate the large number of vehicles on the access road in the mall. Because the intersection in question involves a State highway, Township Administrator E. Kloose suggested contacting the NJDOT Representative D. Hirt for input on how this situation can be rectified.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to contact NJDOT Representative D. Hirt to discuss lane stacking that is occurring at the traffic light located at Sussex County Mall and State Highway Route 206.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE & RESCUE, INC. OFF-PREMISE 50/50 RAFFLE  
LICENSE #2012-1034 TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 19, 2012 AT THE BALEVILLE  
CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to approve a 50/50 Off-Premise Raffle for the Baleville Congregational Church as referenced above.

**UPDATE REGARDING IKE WILLIAMS ROAD**

Township Administrator E. Klose gave an update about a sinkhole located on Ike Williams Road. She stated that Township Engineer D. Simmons contacted Geologist J. Fisher following the May 29, 2012 Township Committee Meeting to discuss the best approach for resolving the current situation. Initially, a suggestion was made to repair the sinkhole by filling it with flowable fill. However, Mr. Fisher proposed stabilizing the sinkhole by filling it with concrete sand prior to installing flowable fill material to see if the sand alone will rectify the problem. It is possible that the sand will only work as a temporary solution or that it might create a sinkhole in a different location.

Township DPW Manager D. Bayles had reported that the sand fill has not deteriorated to date, even after with the heavy rains that have recently moved through the region.

The Township Committee agreed by full consensus to delay using flowable fill in the sinkhole until it can be determined whether the sinkhole can be adequately repaired using sand fill.

**HAMPTON VS. SUSSEX COUNTY AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT BOARD**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township Attorney F. McGovern had a conference with Judge Rio regarding the pending State Agriculture Development Commission's (SADC) Agriculture Management Practice (AMP) draft. The Judge indicated that she would like to put *Hampton vs. Sussex County Agriculture Development Board* on the inactive list for a period of six months, at which point the AMP document should be finalized. In order for this to take place, both parties must agree to the inactive status by June 29, 2012.

Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that the majority of the AMP document favors Hampton Township's position regarding farming activities. Therefore, he suggested that the Township Committee agree to place the case on the inactive list for six months until the AMP have been completed.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to approve placing *Hampton Township vs. Sussex County Agriculture Development Board* on the inactive list for a period of six months, as recommended by Township Attorney S. Roseman.

**CRANDON LAKES SPEED HUMPS**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that DPW Manager D. Bayles installed temporary speed humps in Crandon Lakes. The issue of whether to install temporary speed humps or permanent speed humps was raised at the Township Committee Meeting on May 29, 2012. At that time, Committeeman D. Hansen stated that he would research both options prior to the next meeting.

The Township Committee reviewed information pertaining to speed humps submitted by Committeeman D. Hansen. Some of the potential problems associated with permanent humps include difficulty with snowplowing, damage to snowplows/trucks, additional noise levels due to constant deceleration/acceleration of snowplows, and the cost of additional signage and traffic paint to delineate the hump approach. Committeeman K. Gourlay concurred that stripping permanent speed humps each year is very costly.

A MOTION was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, with the exception of Committeeman D. Hansen, who opposed, to have DPW Manager D. Bayles provide additional information regarding the installation of speed humps in Crandon Lakes.

## DISCUSSION

Township Administrator E. Kloose stated that she received an email from Lieutenant D. Rome, of the Sussex County Sheriff's Office, regarding background checks that his office will be conducting for Hampton Township Volunteer Fire & Rescue, Inc. In his email, Lieutenant D. Rome stated that he would provide township and fire officials with details about the actual process as that information becomes available. Township Administrator E. Kloose stated that she forwarded the email to HTVFR President B. Wehrenberg.

Township Attorney S. Roseman stated that he met with Stillwater Attorney L. Comb and Hampton Township resident K. Bradley to discuss the township line separating Hampton Township and Stillwater Township. The question was initially raised by Hampton Township residents Mr. & Mrs. Bradley at an earlier Hampton Township Committee Meeting in response to a cell tower application proposed in Stillwater Township. The Bradley's are concerned that the proposed location for the tower might be in Hampton Township rather than Stillwater Township. However, Hampton Township tax maps indicate that the location of the tower is not in Hampton Township.

Hampton Township Attorney S. Roseman noted that the Stillwater Township Committee denied the cell tower application, but the applicant, JCP&L, is contesting the denial in Court. He added that Stillwater Township Attorney L. Comb suggested that Hampton Township participate in the lawsuit. Attorney S. Roseman recommended that the Township Committee give consideration to the cost associated with this type of endeavor. The Township Committee agreed by full consensus not to participate in the lawsuit.

Township Attorney stated that he spoke to Township Engineer H. Pellow about a drainage issue on Kemah Mecca Lake Road in Hampton Township. Township equipment cannot adequately handle the repair, therefore, an outside contractor must be hired to remediate the problem. Township Engineer H. Pellow does not believe that the township will be required to bid the job because the cost should not exceed the bid threshold of \$17,500. Attorney S. Roseman stated that Engineer H. Pellow would like to prepare a Request for Proposal for the Township Committee's review.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman D. Coranoto, with all members in favor, to authorize Township Engineer H. Pellow to prepare a Request for Proposal to repair a drainage issue on Kemah Mecca Lake Road in Hampton Township.

Committeeman D. Coranoto noted that Hampton Day was a great success this year. The Township Committee complimented the effort put forth by Township Employee Valerie Galizia and Recreation Chairperson Sue Rude, who both organized the event. Attendees enjoyed many special activities that Ms. Galizia added to this year's festivities.

Committeeman D. Coranoto raised concerns about the traffic light located at the intersection of Halsey Road (County Rt. 628) and County Rt. 519. County officials had agreed to adjust the light's timing mechanism to reduce the wait time for vehicles stopped on both sides of Halsey Road. Committeeman D. Coranoto noted that the county has not adjusted the traffic light to date. A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to send a letter to county officials requesting an explanation in writing as to

why the timing mechanism on the traffic light referenced above has not been adjusted and how they intend to address the matter.

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Committeeman D. Hansen stated that Hampton Township Volunteer Fire & Rescue, Inc. still has tickets available for their Food & Wine Fundraising Event on June 30, 2012.

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Committeeman T. Dooley stated that he submitted the site plan for the Mike Biron Field of Dreams Lighting Project to the Township Planning Department earlier today. The matter will be on the August Agenda of the Township Planning Board.

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Township officials discussed setting a policy which bans the sale of certain items at Hampton Day. Township officials are in the process of compiling a list in preparation for next year.

### **HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE**

Township EMS Captain T. Defabritis-Webbe reported that HTFR EMS has responded to 247 calls year-to-date.

HTVFR Chief D. Gunderman stated that the fire department is in the process of transitioning their computer software, therefore, a Fire Report is not available for this meeting.

### **PUBLIC SESSION**

Mr. K. Fletcher was present and thanked township officials for providing him with the opportunity to operate the Township Pavilion (Pit) during the 2012 Spring Season. He stated that it was a very positive experience and he is interested in operating the concession stand next year, and if possible, on Hampton Day 2013. Mr. Fletcher stated that he recently spoke with Hampton Township Volunteer Fire & Rescue officials about operating the Pit on Hampton Day. Certain fire officials indicated that they do not wish to operate the Pit next year and were agreeable to Mr. Fletcher taking it over. Committeeman D. Hansen agreed to address the issue with fire department officials at their meeting scheduled for June 27, 2012.

In response to an inquiry directed to Mr. Fletcher regarding his availability during the 2012 Fall Season, he stated there are not enough sporting events to support him operating the Pit during the fall.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Coranoto and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize Mr. Keith Fletcher to operate the concession stand in the Township Pavilion during the 2013 Spring Season, and in addition, on Hampton Day 2013, providing Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. declines the opportunity to do so.


