STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Paul Morrison Shadel was born in Orange on January 21, 1897 to Thomas Morrison Shadel, head of the Shadel Furniture Company, and his wife Sadie. Paul was the youngest of three boys. The grand house the Shadel family lived in still stands today at the intersection of Chapman and Grand, just next to the main Orange Library and across from Orange City Hall (look for the realtor-occupied building with the white columns).

Sometime around 1913 or 1914, Paul married Beatrice Brown and started a family. They welcomed a son, Glen, in December 1914, followed by a daughter Dorothy in 1922 and their final son Wallace who came in 1925.

Paul entered the US Navy around the time the US entered World War I. We weren't able to track down his specific enlistment date, but we knew he was serving by 1917 due to a record trail indicating his admission into a Naval hospital at Fort Lyon in Las Animas, Colorado, where he was treated for scabies.

During his time in the Navy, which continued through the 1930s, Paul served as a Pharmacist Mate, contributing to the health and well-being of Navy sailors. He mainly served in the San Diego

area, but from approximately 1928 to 1929, he and his family temporarily relocated to a Naval base in Nicaragua, which was under U.S. control from 1912 until 1933.

The 1930s brought new changes as Paul and his family moved to Vallejo, California, seeking new opportunities and adventures. In December 1937, Paul was nominated to be a postmaster in Ramona, California. He was confirmed by the United States Senate in January, and started his role as postmaster the following month.

The 1940s marked another significant chapter in Paul's life. World War II swept across the globe, and Paul, with his deep commitment to his country, reentered service in 1941 in the Naval Hospital Corps.

Postmaster Confirmed

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25. (AP)— The Senate confirmed today the nomination of Paul Morrison Shadel to be postmaster at Ramona, Cal.

Notably, Paul wasn't the only member of the family to answer the call of duty during World War II. His sons Glen and Wallace also served in the Army during the war (Glen was in the Army Air Force, which became a separate branch of the military in 1947). All the Shadel men survived World War II.

After the war Paul went back to the San Diego area. In 1946, he married his second wife: Marjorie Kranz. By 1950 Paul was working for the San Diego City Health Department. Tragedy struck in 1965 when Paul's son Wallace passed away at the age of 39. The loss would weigh heavily on Paul's shoulders in his final years. Two years later, Paul himself would pass away in San Diego at age 70.

We salute you Lieutenant Shadel for your service in the U.S. Navy during WW1 and WW2.

NATION OF PATRIOTS 50-STATE FLAG TOUR


