THE SIGN OF THE FIG TREE

While hundreds of prophecies are given to us pertaining to the returning of Jesus back to earth again, to me the greatest sign is of the fig tree or the rebuilding and re-establishing of Jerusalem. This great sign involves many scriptures thru the Bible, yet, the majority of people have failed to see this which is the most visible sign of the day.

All through the scriptures there are types and symbols. Moses bringing Israel out of bondage unto the promised land was a type of the Christ. Even Joseph before, was a type of the Christ. He being sold into bondage as a slave, yet thru that act, he in later years was the source of life to these, that had sold him. Jesus was betrayed by Judas and sold for the price of a slave, (thirty pieces of silver), but thru that fulfilled "His sure word of prophecy," and brought eternal life to all. Therefore as the fig tree was very prevalent in Palestine we feel that Jewry and Palestine is spoken of by Jesus as the fig tree.

For the leading thought let us read in Matt. 24:32-33, "Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is nigh: So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors." Here we have a parable, a prophecy of Christ that we should know and recognize—the fig tree and the putting on of leaves, we know that the summer is nigh even at the door. It is always our desire for the spring and the summer after the long, dark, dreary days of winter. In this cold dark uncertain world of today, there is a hope as we look

thru the eye of prophecy to the summer which is nigh.

Jewry has experienced two captivities and two restorations, also they have had one dispersion; and the third and final restoration is now taking place. "And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled." Luke 21:24. During their captivities they have been subjects of certain nations; but here Jesus spoke of them being "led away into all nations"—in other words a dispersion. Also Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles for a certain time. How long, "Till the time of the Gentiles be fulfilled." Another scripture we should read on this thought is Rom. 11:25, "For I would not, brethren that ye should be ignorant of this mystery . . . That blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in, which proves to us that Palestine shall be ruled and over-run by the Gentiles.

We are made to wonder why Palestine shall come back into the hands of the Jewish people. Though Abraham was the grandfather of Jacob, to whom God said, "Israel shall be thy name." We understand that all Jews are Israelites yet not all Israelites are Jews. The Jews are from the tribe of Judah. All through the ages the Jewry has looked back to the blessing and promises of

God to their father Abraham.

We find (Gen. 13:14) the land given to Abraham. Then in Gen. 15:18, "Unto thy seed have I given this land, from the river of Egypt unto the great river, the river Euphrates." Here we have the first deed and title to be recorded. It was a gift of love to Abraham because of his faithfulness to God. Out of the 32,640,000,000 acres that compose the land surface of the earth, God reserved for Abraham 192,000,000 acres which should be for him and his seed forever. Lev. 25:23, "The land shall not be sold forever: for the land is mine;". Because of sin and disobedience their land was lost for awhile. I rather feel that it was the sins of the sons of Jacob for selling their own flesh and blood, Joseph, and during the famine they had to go to Egypt and dwell there leaving their inheritance to live in a strange land. They were brought under captivity and bondage. God surely warned them of disobedience.

"And it shall come to pass, that as the Lord rejoiceth to do you good, and to multiply you; so the Lord will rejoice over you to destroy you, and to bring you to nought: and ye shall be plucked from off the land, wither thou goest to possess it. And the Lord shall scatter thee among all people, from one end of the earth even to the other; . . . and among these nations shalt thou find no ease, neither shall the sole of thy foot have rest, but the Lord shall give thee there a trembling heart, and failing of eyes, and sorrow of mind: And thy life shall hang in doubt before thee; and thou shalt fear day and night, and shalt have none assurance of thy life: In the morning thou shalt say, Would God it were even! And at even thou shalt say, Would God it were morning! for the fear of thine heart wherewith thou shalt fear, and for the sight of thine eyes which thou shalt see. And the Lord shall bring thee into Egypt again with

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ships, by the way whereof I spake unto thee, Thou shalt see it no more again: and there ye shall be sold unto your enemies for bondmen and bondwomen, and no man shall buy you." Deut. 28:63-68.

By this scripture we can see that the Lord would delight in blessing and multiplying His people: nevertheless in the same scriptures are found the curse of disobedience.

Forty years after the Jews cried "Let His blood be on us, and on our children," Titus beseiged the Holy City of Jerusalem and the Temple was destroyed not leaving one stone upon the other. The Jewish people were sold as bondmen and bondwomen and the slave market was so glutted with them that no man would buy them. Hundreds of Jews were slain.

In Isaiah 5:5-6 we read, "And now go to: I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard: I will take away the hedge thereof, and it shall be eaten up; and break down the wall thereof, and it shall be trodden down; And I will lay it waste: it shall not be pruned, nor digged; but there shall come up briars and thorns: I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it." Here we have the curse pronounced and the reason was found in the preceding verses of the verses we just read. Because the husbandmen of the very fruitful hill had gathered out the stones, and fenced, then built a winepress, and planted the "choicest vine." He came to the vineyard for fruit but found wild grapes. Surely Jesus was the choicest vine—planted in a very fruitful hill (Palestine). John 1:11, "He came to his own and His own received Him not ... "They rejected and crucified Him; therefore we have the curse—even upon the vineyard. In 70 A. D. the wall was broken down, the hedge removed, the land became desolate, briars and thorns came to the very fruitful hill and it became even as a desert. The clouds were forbidden to rain no rain upon this land. For hundreds of years it did not rain. Desolation settled upon this nation. The Pools of Solomon which he built in his day for a reservoir for the Holy City were dry for hundreds of years because of the curse. During the early '20's the British repaired the Pools at a cost of \$32,000,000 in order to collect water during the winter months for the increasing population of Palestine. Then in 1927 the Pools filled and were overflowing. In Isaiah 35:1 . . . "and the desert shall rejoice and shall blossom as a rose." While the early rain and the latter rain have fallen in the spiritual real, the literal seasons of Palestine of old is being restored. While for years they were dependent on other nations, today very much exporting is being done. Millions of fine cuttings have been planted on her hillsides, oranges and many other fruits are growing in abundance. The Jews are tilling the soil that God gave him by the latest methods of modern agriculture. By the sign of agriculture "the fig tree is putting forth its leaves."

When Titus beseiged the city not only the temple was destroyed, but the city was left in ruins. According to the latest reports, the most modern designs of architecture have been and are being used in Palestine. The funds have been raised and much of the materials are on the ground site for the rebuild-

ing of the temple. From the building program we can see the fig tree putting forth leaves.

We read in the scriptures about the People—you shall be scattered. They have been scattered throughout the nations of the world. Their afflictions have been such no pen could describe. They have been whipped, beaten with rods, stoned, robbed, and burned alive. In many nations for centuries they were not allowed to own a foot of ground or testify in court. At the time of Christ there were about four million Jews but today we have between twenty and thirty million. In Jer. 30:11... "Though I make a full end of all nations where I have scattered thee, yet will I not make a full end of thee: . . . " Christian, may I call your attention to this fact, that in all these nations where the Jews were scattered and persecuted—wherever persecution came to the Jew, persecution to the Christians followed and furthermore there are anti-Semetic leagues in our country today. You might say that you hate and despise them. Firstly in speaking to you—you must love and practice the teaching of Jesus to be a Christian. Secondly, let the scripture speak in Gen. 12:3 . . . "I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee." In these last days when God is having them come back to their homeland and many places the sword wielded to drive them back. We are made to realize "His sure word of prophecy is being fulfilled." While the Jews have been abused and have been as vagabonds throughout the earth. The nations of the world had better deal carefully with them. In Zech. 12:9 . . . and it shall come to pass in that day that I shall seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem. Today Jewry is crying and praying to Jehovah God for deliverence and that they might have their homeland. While in 1917 the British Government favored a national home for the Jew, yet for these years they have held the mandation over this land. The Jewish people have been and are dissatisfied. I rather think at this next peace table, we shall see Palestine given back to the Jew for a homeland and if so then the days of the Gentiles shall be fulfilled. They will offer their sacrifices which will be accepted unto the Lord.

In Zech 13:1, "In that day there shall be a foundation opened to the house

of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness.

The fig tree putteth forth leaves, summer is nigh.

American Youth And the Church

I believe with all my heart that the Church is the greatest institution in the world today. Without a doubt, it is the largest single organization the world has ever known. Though composed of many who approach the end by different means, yet in the main they are working for the selfsame purpose. We have the machinery, but I am afraid we are losing the power to make that machinery do its fullest capacity of work for Christ.

We have, and I hesitate to use the word, ministers who have left the old paths. No longer is the fundamental faith of our fathers good enough. "We are living in a modern age," we are told. "We have discovered many things in the realm of the sciences that have lifted us out of the superstitious ideas of our pilgrim fathers." These master deceivers tell us that our responsibilities are no longer spiritual, but social. And the social gospel has swept our nation. In many cases it has swept out all true godliness, and left in its place this froth and foam of modern religious thought that will one day damn its followers.

The parents and authorities of our nation are wringing their hands because our youth will no longer attend church. Why should they attend? There was a time when the Church was something to believe in; something to have faith in. When everything else had failed, there was still the Church. Not so today. These "pioneers" in the field of religious thought have done away with all that. So, the

youth of our nation will no longer attend a powerless Church that prays to a powerless God and has nothing but a powerless form of godliness.

How can the youth of today believe in the Christ of the Church and His saving power through His shed blood when they hear such words as these from the lips of a leading Modernist minister? "Never again offend our sensibilities with talk about the blood of Christ." Another says, "Literal infallibility of the Bible is a fortress impossible to defend." Still another makes this statement: "A father who had to be reconciled to his children, whose wrath had to be appeased or whose forgiveness could be purchased, is not the Father of Jesus Christ."

How can our youth believe when they hear these statements coming from those who are supposedly representatives of Christ and the Church? I often think that perhaps one reason for this war is the fact that our young people have been robbed of their faith. If they are not taught to pray and have faith in God and the Church, then they must learn in the foxholes of battle.

There are some 35,000,000 young people from the ages of four to eighteen in America. Seventeen million no longer attend religious services. In the past four years there has been a slump of more than 20 per cent in Protestant Sunday school attendance, which means that more than 3,500,000 that were attending four years ago no longer attend.

In a recent survey of juvenile courts it was discovered that 97 per cent of the youths convicted of crime have had no religious training. Surely these facts and statistics show that this "New Thought" is highly unsuccessful. Our juvenile delinquency problem increases at a prodigious rate every year. The very structure of our

nation is being eaten away by the ecclesiastical termites that are disgracing our pulpits today.

Preachers all over America are trying to solve the difficulty of getting people into the Church, each in their own way. They are bringing worldly amusements into the Church. I talked to one preacher who told me that he had solved his young people's church attendance problem. This he had done by having "Recreation Night." On this gala occasion he would show a motion picture that was having a current run; then followed a dance in the basement: the evening's activities were climaxed by refreshments, followed by a short talk on character or some other subject. This minister was highly insulted when I observed that he seemed to be running a religious night club.

Such a procedure will never meet with success. First of all, if the Church is going to bring in worldly amusements, then it must compete with the world in the manner and perfection of their presentation. This it can never hope to do. If our young people want to dance they will go where they can hear a professional orchestra composed of talented musicians. If they want to see a show they will go to a theater production, not one that is presented in amateur fashion in a church basement.

Secondly, young people of our day lose faith in those who compromise. Bringing the world into the Church smacks of compromise of the worst kind and will drive youth away before it will attract them. Too, it is an admission that the world has more to effer than does the Church. This I do not believe, for in the Church and in its faith is the answer to every man's problem, whether young or old.

We do not need entertainment; we

need Christ. We do not need a great social program; we need Christ—just the simple, plain, unembellished Gospel of Christ preached from a heart that has found Him sufficient. A Gospel that works will do more to return our young people to the churches of our land than work and programs and all else we might do.

I would say briefly that there is another kind of Church—one that preaches a negative Gospel: "You cannot do this; you cannot do that." Such preaching will not attract young people. While I certainly do not believe in worldly compromise, neither do I believing a Gospel of law. We are living in an age of grace, and we serve Christ not because we fear eternal fiery retribution if we do not, but rather because we love Him and have found in Him the satisfaction of our every desire.

You simply cannot drive the world out of young people; but you can lead them higher and higher in the things of God until the world drops off of itself. When you can show young people something to take the place of the things they now enjoy in the world, you will have accomplished what negative preaching will never do.

We need young people in the Church, and young people need to be in the Church. What we must do is pattern our ministry to the things that lead upward toward something that is far better than they now have.



GROWING THROUGH ADVERSITY

A GOOD PHILOSOPHY FOR THE TIME OF TROUBLE

To say that these are troublous days may be trite, but to recognize that our very troubles afford us an unusual opportunity for Christian growth is the part of wisdom. We find ourselves confronted with rather disturbing situation for which we must work out solution. Problems arise with rapidity and persistence, for our world is so quickly changing, and we are forced to keep pace. Our life structure is shaken by these intense new demands. For some, major adjustments must be made, adjustments involving the home -nd family, occupations, one's over-all plans of life. For all, minor adjustments involve round-the-clock activities. But our point is that these conditions may prove either to be damaging or growthprovoking, according to the way we react.

Human life has always been this way, but these factors are now intensified. However, the genius of the Christian is that he can grow in grace in a world of tribulations. Whatever his circumance may be, he grows by overcoming the obstacles that would defeat mm. But, unfortunately, we Christian do not always grow; we stand still, or we even regress. Let us see just how it is and how we may more favorably incline ourselves toward Christian growth.

Our Attitude Important

To shut our eyes to problems is impossible, for then we close our minds to reality and get nowhere. Here, we must be realistic. It is always easier to create a world of fantasy in which our problems do not exist, but this is a way toward insanity.

Again, it is easier to become despondent and just give up. Regression

sets in. Once it could be said with respectability that circumstances made us and that we could not avail over them, but the more recent trend in psychology, and always the Christian viewpoint, is that we need not be victims of our environment. Rather, we can respond to our environment creatively and alter hindering circumstances. Yet, withal, favorable theories may not bring practical results if our will are obstinate or our minds distracted.

Moreover, anxiety may control us. Inordinate fear and worry render us helpless, for the anxious mind cannot be creative. Here we need faith. Then only can we be still and know God. Only then can God lead us in thinking through our problems to their best solutions. And, certainly, we can be assured that the Spirit of the great Creator-God can effect a creative spirit in us. Certainly, He who so wisely solved the problem of sinning man can enable us to cope successfully with any situation. We may do well to recognize our weakness, but we must go on to faith in order that God's strength be made perfect in us. We must, for truly as Isaiah has said, "in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength" (Isa. 30:15). With poise there comes creativeness, especially so with those who are led by the Spirit of God. Our faith is that with every testing God provides a way out.

With such an attitude, our whole out-look on life will be different. We will face life's problems with an intellect made keen with imagination, with a spontaniety and perserverance inborn of God's Spirit. No matter how stubborn the obstacle may be, we will

try, pray, and try again and again until God leads us through. Whatever our thorn in the flesh may be, we will carefully work out a successful adjustment. We will have a life philosophy or adjustment according to the will of God.

Because of such an attitude, a faith, and a perseverance by the Spirit, we will not only find and do the will of God, but we shall undergo, in this personal kind of victorious living. growth. This growth of personality will evidence itself in all our life's relationships. Character will be developed and enriched. Mental ability will increase. Our spirits will be freer. We will have a flexibility about us enabling us to absorb life's shocks, reacting in godly ways. We will be better people to live with and we ourselves will enjoy God's best in life.

Specifically, this growth takes place through stimulation. One has described man as "protoplasmic irritability," recognizing the law of growth by stimulation. Conflicts, frictions, obstructions necessitate change or adjustment, requiring the realization of one's powers for life. Life is this growth, a process of change, a becoming.

With all growth there comes greater power; solve certain problems and there is increased ability in any kind of problem-solving. As a child more readily grows in mind and spirit by problem-solving, so it is at any age level. Struggle sharpens our wits. Likewise, spiritual growth comes through Spirit-directed interaction with our environment, bringing our Christian ideals to bear upon our actual world.

With this viewpoint and understanding, we will not cringe from life, but meet it gladly, come whatever God may allow. We will realize that in life's cauldron of experience our dross can be refined and the beauty of the indwelling Christ shall then shine

forth. This growth unto Him is our hope of glory!

The Committee has estimated the cost of purchase and needed improvements such as building an annex etc. to be approximately \$8,000. The building would be deeded to the Apostolic Faith Movement and held in trust by a Board of Trustees.

Each church is entitled to one vote, and each church is urged to send a delegate. If impossible to send a delegate, they are requested to send their vote by letter or otherwise.

The Committee has appointed Evang. Ben Barker Box 135, Laverne, Okla. to receive all donations given for the Bi-, ble School.
