**<u>Financial</u>** – Based on the club's end-of-the-year bottom line figure of approximately \$1500, and Linda Henderson's conservative recommendation for limiting our donation to Missions this year, there was a great deal of discussion regarding the potential increase in dues and future donations. Last year we spent almost \$3600 for donations and Harvey relief. While we are a non-profit club, Pete Poulsen reminded the group that our purpose (as stated above) does not include donations. The following was agreed:

Membership dues will remain the same (\$15/\$20).

We will add an extra line in membership forms for "voluntary contributions" to the club.

The club will donate \$500 to the Geezer Squad this year for wheelchair ramps.

Pete Poulsen, Jean Drummond and Linda Henderson will determine a bottom-line financial <u>reserve</u> for our club (for honorariums, equipment, events like the Harvey relief, etc.) and further donations each year will be based on that.

Members requesting refunds are to complete the <u>Check Request Form</u> (to be available on the website) before turning in to Jean Drummond with receipts.

### Membership:

After some discussion regarding attracting younger members, it was determined that the 50-to-60-year-old age group (empty-nesters, more time on their hands) should be the group to attract.

All of us will try to find an <u>Outreach Coordinator</u> who will help advertise this club to the church (the Loft in particular), photographic classes at schools/college, the Villager, etc.

Everyone on the Advisory Board should make it a habit to welcome new members and visitors at the primary Monday night meeting.

Mac Rodgers volunteered to create a membership list. This list, without addresses, will be distributed to club members with a statement that it is not to be used for any commercial enterprises.
