A RESOLUTION

A Resolution adopting the federally approved Seneca County All Hazard Mitigation Plan, and declaring an emergency to exist.

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Fostoria recognizes the threat that natural, human-caused, and technological hazards pose to people and property within the City of Fostoria; and

WHEREAS Seneca County has prepared a multi-hazard mitigation plan, hereby known as Seneca County Hazard Mitigation Plan of December 20, 2019, in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS the Seneca County Hazard Mitigation Plan identifies mitigation goals and action to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in Seneca County from the impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS adoption by the Council of the City of Fostoria demonstrates their commitment to the hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Seneca County All Hazard Mitigation Plan of December 20, 2019.

WHEREAS the plan has been approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

**SECTION 1.** The Council of the City of Fostoria hereby adopts the Seneca County Hazard Mitigation Plan, which will be available for review in the office of the Safety Service Director or at <https://sharpp.dps.ohio.gov/ohiosharpp/> upon final federal approval.

**SECTION 2.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION 3.** This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The reason for such emergency lies in the fact that said plan must be adopted by February 28, 2020 and forwarded to the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council and signature by the Mayor, this Resolution shall go into immediate force and effect.







AN ORDINANCE

Adopting and Amending ordinance No. 2019-56 (Permanent 2020 Appropriations) by decreasing appropriations and appropriating from unappropriated funds in the General Fund, the Beautification Fund, and CHIP Fund and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That ordinance No. 2019-56 (Permanent 2020 Appropriations) passed December 17, 2019, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

SECTION 2: That Sixteen Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$16,750) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-660-500130 General Fund – Transportation-Airport/Personal Service-Part Time Salaries.

SECTION 3: That Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-120-561860 General Fund – Security of Persons and Property-Fire/Other-Refunds.

SECTION 4: That Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 241-499-561860 Beautification Fund – Community Environment-Community Development/Other-Refunds.

SECTION 5: That Eighty-Five Thousand Five Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$85,519) be decreased from funds appropriated to 245-428-531700 CHIP Fund – Community Environment-CDBG/Contractual Services-Other Contractual Services.

SECTION 6: That Forty Thousand Two Hundred Eighty Six Dollars (\$40,286) be decreased from funds appropriated to 245-435-531700 CHIP Fund – Community Environment-OHTF/Contractual Services-Other Contractual Services.

SECTION 7: That Three Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars (\$336,757) be decreased from funds appropriated to 245-439-531700 CHIP Fund – Community Environment-HOME/Contractual Services-Other Contractual Services.

SECTION 8: That Ninety Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Five Dollars (\$98,755) be decreased from funds appropriated to 245-441-531700 CHIP Fund – Community Environment-Other Program Income/Contractual Services-Other Contractual Services.



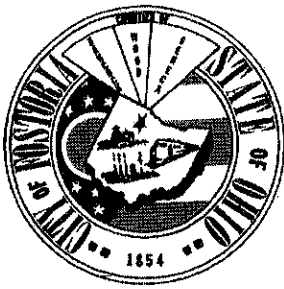

### **Minutes of Previous Meeting**

Reviewed and approved by: Councilperson Logsdon and Councilperson Hopple.

### **Old Business:**

- Discussed revisions to street signage included in the proposed ordinance. Specifically, Stop signs at Union and Thomas Streets. Should it be 2-way or 4-way stop? Should parking be kept back from intersection so people can see if it is clear to pull out? Safety Service Director should check if we need to have ODOT review the removal of the stop light. Speeding on Union is a concern.
- Continued discussions concerning one-sided parking on Jackson Street. South side is used but is the side where the fire hydrants are located. Safety is an issue and could be basis for parking opposite of fire hydrants on all streets in question.
- Ordinance 505.23 b. needs to be revised since the City of Fostoria does not have a Dog Warden. There were 310 animal complaints in 2019. Police work to address them but must call in Hancock or Seneca County humane departments for assistance.

### **New Business:**

- Ordinance concerning fences needs to be revised to clarify permitting requirements and clarify repair versus replace.
- Star & Anderson Streets – there is no signage at intersection. A stop is needed.

- Ordinance 147.06 – received a request from Police Chief for an immediate repeal of 1987 ordinance. Police have department policy in place to address.
- Ordinance 351.20 – parking in yard is not allowed. Should considered adding removal of vehicles by City if multiple offences occur.


Kevin Magers, discussed stop signs at Union and Thompson. Feels a two-way stop is appropriate.



Councilperson Cassidy stated he thought it was good news to read about the Metrich Drug Task received \$240,640.79 thru the allocation of Governor DeWine.


