Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 21:5-19

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Tim McGraw, the country music singer just published a new book on fitness & exercise titled Grit and Grace detailing the need for discipline and determination when it comes to training our minds, training our bodies and 'training our souls' (I say). Two years ago, a research psychologist from University of Pennsylvania named Angela Duckworth wrote a book about her research into self-control and resilience, titled Grit: The Power of Passion and Perseverance. Then, in today's gospel, Jesus teaches us that, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives" (Luke 21:19). What is this all about? I suggest that Jesus Himself wrote **THE** book on grit-the strength to keep on moving in the face of adversity. So, Jesus tells His followers that what will lead us through all opposition is our holding steady to our guiding hope and remaining close to Him. Another word for grit and perseverance is simply "Faith". Keep the Faith, and the faith will keep you. (Interestingly, Tim McGraw has his 'Faith' too! -Tim is following Jesus' advice about helpers from Luke 10:1!) But, our faith is what keeps us going when the external supports collapse, or are taken from us. Jesus cautions that the disappearance of visible structures will happen inevitably. This is what he means with the reference to the Temple stones. It is easy to follow Jesus down the hill from Calvary after the resurrection, but what about the hike of death up the hill. That takes perseverance. Faith is the activation and kicking in of one's training (Christian Prayer and Practices to carry us onward). St Paul told Timothy to 'proclaim the word; be persistent in season and out of season' (2 Tim 4:2). Again, be persistent, when it is easy *and* when it is not easy. Our faith performs, in the seen and the unseen.

Today's gospel opened with Jesus overhearing a comment from someone praising the beauty of the Temple's Architecture, its stone and design. Jesus' pragmatic response points out how easy is to claim faith when everybody does it, and alongside such publicly supportive benefits like the imposing and grand civic monuments of a Temple. Jesus is saying that it is easy to pray and claim to be part of the Temple when you are sitting safely inside its protection. But, what do you do when you are walking along the street? Faith is proven in the pinch. Faith is real, when we accept some pain in the practice of it-that is faith's grit!) Crowds were always in the Temple areas, but how many Christians were at the pillar with Jesus. What about at the Cross? Who gathered at the tomb? Faith is what strengthens one to show up sacrificially (when you otherwise don't want to, or the world doesn't want you to!) This Temple Talk opens the door for Jesus to discuss the end times or times of trial when everything seems to be against you. The solid stones of the Temple mean nothing after they are fallen and scattered. Then, if ever, a person's own firmness of faith is what gets one through, or passes the test.

More than the Temple's stones being turned to rubble, Jesus adds other examples of trial such as 'wars, insurrections, earthquakes, famines, plagues and persecutions'. And here is where Faith shines. What if there wasn't public support of religion, or the majority protections of practicing a particular belief were taken away? What would we do without publicly sanctioned opportunities for religion? Do we need some Caesar to be able to practice our faith? What if the external support of religious freedom crumbled? Well, such times are exactly when faith is vindicated. Like a sports fan continuing to show up at games through a devastating, losing season, so a true believer continues to practice and preach even if he/she is the only one still standing. Such believers re-set the cornerstone of religion. Back on Oct 29, 2016, when a 6.6 magnitude earthquake almost ripped down completely the San Benedetto Basilica in Norcia, the Benedictine monks and nuns did not wrap it up and quit their way of living. No, they moved on. Or how about the recent devastating fire at Notre Dame, Paris April 15, 2019. Did it end Catholicism in France? No, it just strengthened a commitment to restore or build again. So when these monuments of faith disappear, our faith shouldn't crumble like their facades might? No, it is precisely faith that shines as an interior light, and keeps on unafraid to face anew these trials. One's inner faith and determination in Christ is the 'grit of grace' that will keep you going in the face of diversions and destructions. St Paul or someone close to him, who knew more than one's share in burden and of battles, closes one of his letters encouraging the church to "Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer" (Romans 12:12).
