After his death, his children started a Foundation to continue his efforts and to follow in his footsteps. A food pantry for the Samantha community has evolved out of the Foundation. "We do things a little different than daddy did. He grew most of the food he gave away and was a one man show, so to speak. We have formed partnerships with our neighbors and businesses so that we can multiply the principle he taught us – to take care of those down on their luck", says Larry Williamson. An Operations Board was formed in August of 2015 to manage the pantry.

"Every family has a story", says Becky Williamson-Martin, "Welcome to ours. We come from a long line of love – a family of deep roots. And like the roots on redwood trees that reach out and intertwine with each other in order to stand strong, we recognize that we need our neighbors and friends support to help make our community strong. We believe God wants us to be like giant redwood trees supporting each other and planting shade trees for others to sit under. So we invited others to join us and we found that there are a lot of servant hearts who are ready and eager to get in on the fun."

"It is our desire to always honor and glorify our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in all we do. That's what Dad did. He glorified The Good Shepherd when he was feeding the community. And I'm so thankful for the legacy he left us", Ricky Williamson.
