WEEKLY THOUGHTS THIRD SUNDAY OF APRIL 14th 2024

Dear friends, this weekend we arrive at the Third Sunday of Easter. Like the disciples, we are filled and amazed with the Easter joy; Christ lives now. We need to feel his presence in the Word and Sacrament.

The Apostles lead by Peter is heard in the first Reading bearing witness with joy to the risen Lord without fear of repercussions from the Jewish authority. Peter boldly proclaims; God glorified Jesus his servant- raised him from the dead. You acted out of ignorance. You have the task to repent.

In the Second Reading; John speaks of the forgiveness of sins Jesus earned for us through his death and left us the Sacrament of Reconciliation that we celebrated on divine mercy Sunday.

In the Gospel Luke 24:35-48; Jesus continues to appear to his frightened and discouraged disciples due to the death of their master. 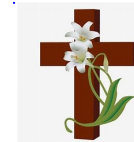
