


# SUMMER READING RULES


1. Summer Reading at the Giles County Public Library is a program with two components: weekly events for children to attend and opportunities for young readers to record their books read and earn prizes. Parents/guardians are highly encouraged to pre-register their child for the Summer Reading Program.
2. As they read, children or parents will write down the titles of books completed in a reading log provided by the library.
3. Twenty five pages is considered a book for logging purposes.

4. After turning in their log once per week, children qualify for two prize opportunities.
  - a. Weekly Prize – every child who participates in the Summer Reading Program will receive a weekly prize for their reading
  - b. Door Prize – for every book read, a child may enter his or her name into a drawing for a door prize. The drawings will be held once a week, and the more titles completed, the more chances the child has to win a prize.
5. At the conclusion of the Summer Reading Program, the library will hold a special event (Movie and Build Your Own Treat) open to children who have read 10 books or more. **Children MUST have read the required number of books in order to participate in this special activity.**
6. The stream walk held at Pleasant Run remains a popular summer tradition and will be held once again on June 28, 2017 at 10:00 AM. Shoes worn into the creek must be closed toe and have a closure of some sort around the back such as tennis shoes, crocs with a strap or water shoes; flip-flops and bare feet will not be allowed. **Children not wearing the appropriate shoes will not be allowed to participate in the stream walk.**
