

From The Pastor's Desk

How Frustrated Are You? Does listening to the news raise your blood pressure? Do you ever think to yourself, "I don't know how much more of the ridiculousness, and political correctness, and blatant rejecting of what is right and fair I can take!"?

If you ever feel that way then I have one thing to say to you: "Good!"

We *should* be frustrated by the things that we witness going on around us. If we don't find ourselves frustrated by them then that means one of two things: either we're floating through life totally oblivious to our surroundings, or we actually approve of the things we witness. Neither one of these options is good.

As Christians, our frustration is brought on primarily by this one fact: we don't belong here. This messed-up world is not our permanent home. There is something better that we yearn for – something eternal.

We may build houses, and put together financial plans, and follow health and fitness regimens that give the impression that we're never going to leave this world. But no matter what we do, a part of us, our inner being, longs to depart and be with the One who made us and has redeemed us. We look forward to the day when all of our irritations will be ancient history – when sin will not even be in our distant memories.

Granted, we're not supposed to do anything to try to hasten our departure from this life. God has given us the task of taking care of ourselves. (It's a stewardship of the body/temple of the Holy Spirit kind of thing – take a look at 1 Cor. 6:19). But still, we eagerly look forward to the day when sin is no more. Even just waiting for that day can help fuel our frustration level.

Paul writes in Romans 8:22-23: For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies.

Yes, we know that much of what we see around us isn't right because of sin, but we also know that Christ has redeemed us (and the world) from that sin and that He has given us the Holy Spirit as a guarantee that things will get better. Until they do, I'm not going to tell you that

you shouldn't get frustrated. What I'm going to tell you is that you shouldn't let the frustration of this life rob you of your joy.

Christ has saved you by His blood. What you experience now is only temporary. You are but a stranger here; heaven is your home. And so wait patiently, with joy, (and even with a bit of frustration), for your redemption draws nigh.


As the Apostle Paul exhorts us, and led by the Holy Spirit, may we strive to grow in the grace and knowledge of God regularly

I often think of this as the small group of faithful quilters come together to work one day a month - but I also know several of us work on these projects at home as well.. None of us claim to have a special talent but no talent is too small or too big for God to use us to show love to other as He loves a sinner like me.

What do we do:

- we can have squares cut for a quilt top
- we assemble these to have a piece for out top
- we assemble the quilt
- a bottom goes down. we add a middle. the top is put in place.
- then we begin to tie it together (we even have a special 'holy cloth' to show us where we want to add the tie)
- we then pin the edges so it can be sewed around and ready for the box.

We can visit while we work together to make the quilts, of course we do take a break for a shared potluck meal and time to have devotion to grow in our faith as well.

Yes some days more help the others, but as I always have said if you can spare and hour or two that is great. The extra pair of hands can make the difference in how many we are able to get ready for shipment ,which is coming up fast. The first Sat in October is the usual date.

As you know we have added the school supplies and health care kits this year. They will ship at same time.

Thanks for the supplies we have so far.

We have had material supplied to us in the past month and this will be tops and bottoms. Tops are 80×60 the bottoms are a couple inches bigger to wrap around and sew to finish the quilt so they are 82×62 .

We will be meeting Sept.16, from 9:30 to 3:30 or there about. So please join us if you can. We always meet the 3rd Wed of the month.
