The Woodland Public Library Board of Trustees Notes

This year has been an exciting and productive year for the Woodland Public Library. Hopefully, many of you have visited the new 745.1 Square One Makerspace and Learning Lab which opened July 1st. The Board of Trustees (BOT) was pleased to see this technology and learning center come to fruition after much hard work and vision on the part of Library Service Director, Greta Galindo and her staff.

Then, without taking a pause to catch its collective breath, the BOT launched into a search to identify an architectural firm to develop a Facility Master Plan (FMP) for the library. Noll & Tam Architects was chosen in a competitive proposal process and this excerpt from their final report explains their directive: "Today, the needs of the community have far outpaced the capacity of the current facility to meet those needs. In 2016, the Library issued a Request for Proposals for a Facility Master Plan in order to identify and plan for the needs of a changing community."

Much data was gathered in formulating the Plan, which included input from Library stakeholders including Woodland Public Library staff, the BOT, Friends of the Library, volunteers, Library patrons, including teens, city residents, city staff, educators, business owners, non-profits and other community groups. The final report was presented to the Woodland City Council on November 7th. The next step will be to identify funding for both long- and short-term goals detailed in the report. Copies of the FMP are available from Library Services Director (LSD), Greta Galindo or can be viewed on the Library's website.

The BOT's final action of 2018 was to complete its annual performance evaluation of LSD, Greta Galindo. Each year, the BOT distributes surveys to Library staff, patrons, and partners to assist with its evaluation which also includes salary and benefits considerations. Without exception, all surveys were returned with positive, glowing reports about our LSD. The Woodland community is fortunate to have such a creative visionary leader and staff mentor overseeing the beautiful Carnegie Library operations. Greta works mainly behind the scenes at the Library, but please make a 2018 resolution to meet her when you are next there. You will surely see a twinkle in her eye as she talks about the many programs the Library offers to the community.

The BOT, composed of five trustees from Woodland, meets twice monthly on Wednesdays in the Library Conference Room at 4:00 P.M. Meetings are open to the public and visitors are welcome.


<u>Holiday Children's Book</u> <u>Giveaway</u>



Winter Reading Challenge coming to the Library in January!

January 1 - January 31, 2018

Billionaire investor and Shark Tank personality Mark Cuban has announced his sponsorship of the inaugural Beanstack Winter Reading Challenge in support of local libraries including the Woodland Public Library. Cuban has challenged close to 100 libraries all over the country and South Korea, to meet a collective goal of reading at least 1.3 million minutes and 55,000 books during the month of January. If achieved, Cuban pledges to donate \$25,000 to First Book, a nonprofit social enterprise that provides new books, learning materials, and other essentials to children in need. He will also give \$10,000 for topperforming libraries to use for their community programs or donate to nonprofit organizations in their area.

In setting up the Winter Reading Challenge, participating libraries were asked what to do with the prize money. First Book was the nonprofit they selected. Through a sustainable, market-driven model, First Book is creating equal access to quality education — making everything from brand-new, high-quality books and educational resources, to sports equipment and snacks, affordable to its member network of more than 350,000 educators who exclusively serve kids in need.

The Woodland Public Library will use Beanstack, to track the amount of time and books read by participants. "After doing a storytime for my local library, Dallas Public Library, I became increasingly inspired by the work libraries do for their communities," says Cuban. "Growing up, my mom used to give me a quarter for every book I read. Through reading programs libraries run with Beanstack, they are providing these kinds of incentives for readers throughout the community. I love the idea that we will encourage readers through a shared, ambitious goal, and that the prize for everyone will be to pay it forward to an awesome organization focused on literacy and access to books.
