## Items of Special Interest to Our Members

- ♦ We will be hosting 3 Edmarc families consisting of 7 adults and 9 children on the weekend of June 14-16 with the children ranging from 2 years old to 18 years old. Rob Heavner has only 4 of the 30 tasks for that weekend signed up for so far so let him know as soon as you can which tasks you would like to look after.
- ♦ Tom Hunter reports that we had 146 pre-registered runners for our Annual Memorial Day Freedom Run (28 runners via email, 108 on line) and 71 race day registrations for a total of 217 runners. Last year we had 143 registrations so the trend is positive.
- ♦ Thanks to a terrific effort on the part of Scott Chandler, Rodney Hockaday, and many Club members we were able to complete the construction of the wheelchair ramp to the Watermen's Museum Carriage House just 24 hours before one of the Museum's busiest weekends! This project began last Fall with the construction of a new flagstone patio and rotation of the Museum's outdoor tent meeting area to provide space for the wheelchair ramp. We must still add handrails to both sides of the 100 feet three tiered ramp so as to comply with current federal guidelines, but the effort on the part of Club members was terrific enabling the Museum to host two weddings that weekend. We could not have done it without the help of three non-Club members who worked tirelessly every afternoon for the last three weeks - they were Stu Pollock (our Club President Michelle Pollock's husband), and Pete and Anne Buse who are volunteers at the Museum.
