Who's Calling?

od called Isaiah: "You are my servant I will make you a light to the nations" (Isaiah 49:3, 6). God called John the Baptist: "The one who sent me to baptize with water..." (John 1:33). God called St. Paul: "Called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus...." (1 Corinthians 1:1). And Paul says God calls us: We are "called to be holy" (1 Corinthians 1:2). Given that call, the question is, "What are we called to do with our lives?"

Frederick Buechner, an author, suggests we are called to wherever our deep hunger and the world's great need meet. As he explains, the world's great need may be to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless, but if we become depressed helping the poor, that is not where God wants us to be. On the other hand, we may love designing sandcastles, but the world has no great need for sandcastles, so that surely is not what God calls us to do. Rather, God calls us to the place where what we love doing and what the world desperately needs intersect.

Adults are often inclined to ask children what they want to be or do when they grow up. Perhaps asking them what they think God wants them to do might be a question laced with greater wisdom. To turn the question may call forth a more thoughtful answer.

Reflect

What is God calling you to do now, and how has God's call changed over the years?

Dear Padre,

I am African American. When I go to church, I feel disconnected from the rest of my life. How does the Church fit with my culture?

Church documents lift up different cultures as treasures to be preserved and incorporated into the life of the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "[The gospel] must be proclaimed, celebrated, and lived in all cultures in such a way that they themselves are not abolished by it, but redeemed and fulfilled: It is with and through their own human culture, assumed and transfigured by Christ, that the multitude of God's children has access to the Father, in order to glorify him in the one Spirit" (CCC 1204).



Many think "catholic" means homogenous, that the Mass should be exactly the same everywhere. On the contrary, it is "catholic" because it takes in everything. It is, or at least it should be, a cross-cultural experience, for we all are the children of God. All cultures should find their expression in the Catholic Mass.

The difficulty is putting this into practice, especially in communities with members from more than one culture. Receptivity on the part of the pastor is important, too. As he learns about another culture, he'll be more open to using the best of it in worship. Perhaps you, along with other concerned parishioners, might discuss this with your pastor. There are resources and institutes available to assist you in making your worship truly reflect who you are individually and communally.



*****2022-23 Mandatory Volunteer/Work Hours*****

After many long hours of discussion with the School Advisory Committee, Home and School, and Parish Council/Administration, each family is now responsible for 5 volunteer hours & 5 work hours for the school per semester (10 volunteer & 10 work hours per year). If those hours are not completed, a fine of \$250 per semester will be added to your account. We will have 4 opportunities for work days (2 days in the Spring & 2 days in the Winter) to attend to help receive the hours. Those days will include outside and inside work which will include painting, yearly maintenance, playground work, deep cleaning, etc. Volunteer hours will consist of committee hours, volunteering at school/classrooms, attending and helping with classroom parties, helping at H&S and school events, etc. We are a family and a family works together to ensure everything is working and running properly. Please do your part to show ownership and pride within our school.
