talents in enhancing the sign is a most gracious way of paying respect to and remembering those who rest there and demonstrating that we care for our beloved departed.



## THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC **CHURCH**

#### Man's Freedom

Freedom is the power, rooted in

reason and will, to act or not to act, to do this or that, and so to perform deliberate actions on one's own responsibility. By free will one shapes one's own life. Human freedom is a force for growth and maturity in truth and goodness; it attains its perfection when directed toward God, our beatitude.

As long as freedom has not bound itself definitively to its ultimate good which is God, there is the possibility of choosing between good and evil, and thus of growing in perfection or of failing and sinning. This freedom characterizes properly human acts. It is the basis of praise or blame, merit or reproach.

The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom excepting the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to "the slavery of sin." Freedom makes man responsible for his acts to the extent that they are voluntary. Progress in virtue, knowledge of the good, and ascesis enhance the mastery of the will over its acts.

Imputability and responsibility for action can be dismissed or even nullified by ignorance, inadvertence, duress, fear, habit, inordinate attachments, and other psychological or **Father Peter** social factors.



## THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS

The month of July is dedicated to The Precious Blood of Jesus. The season's liturgical color is green which is a symbol of hope and arouses in us the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of

heaven and hope of resurrection. The remainder of the year represents the time of our pilgrimage to heaven during which we hope for reward.

## ST. AUGUSTINE ZHOA RONG AND **COMPANIANS** Feast day July 9

At times we have a tendency to consider Christianity something of a western phenomenon. Yet Christianity arrived in China by way of Syria in the 600s or probably earlier just trailing Europe in the fourth (conversation of the Roman Empire) and Ireland in the fifth. Depending on China's relations with the outside world, Christianity over the centuries was free to grow or was forced to operate secretly. The 120 martyrs honored on this feast day died between 1648 and 1930. Eightyseven of them were born in China, and were children, parents, catechists, or laborers, and Chinese diocesan priests ranging in age from nine years to 72. It also includes 33 foreign-born martyrs who were mostly priests or women religious. Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied Bishop John Gabriel Taurin Dufresse of the Paris Foreign Mission Society to his martyrdom in Beijing. Not long after his baptism, Augustine was ordained as a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815. These 120 martyrs were canonized together in Rome on October 1, 2000. The People's Republic of China and the Roman Catholic Church each have well over a billion citizens, but there are only about 12 million Catholics in China. Sadly, the reasons for this are better explained by historical conflicts than by a wholesale rejection of the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Chinese-born martyrs honored by this feast were regarded by their persecutors as dangerous because they were considered allies of enemy, Catholic countries and therefore, by definition, anti-Chinese.

The Good News of Jesus Christ is intended to benefit all peoples; today's martyrs knew that. Given the tensions that exist today between our countries may we all live in such a way that Chinese women and men and citizens of all countries will be attracted to hear the Good News and embrace it.
