Bingo News

Equine Sanctuary

The Pennsylvania Equine Rescue and Retirement Foundation (PERRF) of Monaca, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, recently hosted a Holiday Cash Bash & Bingo Extravaganza, with proceeds going toward PERRF's rescue efforts, equine assistance program and other activities. The reservations-only, sold out event was held at a local fired department social hall at a cost of \$30 per person. Participants enjoyed an extravagant dessert table and were entertainment by a local DJ as they played eight Bingo games for a chance to win prizes and cash, and compete for mystery boxes, auction items and raffle prizes. PERRF is dedicated to rescuing slaughter-bound, abused and neglected horses, providing rescue, rehabilitation and permanent sanctuary to equines in peril. The group also advocates for and educates about the humane treatment of horses by offering adults and families the opportunity to develop and nurture relationships through horse-centered activities.

Black Light Bingo

The Heartland Rotary Club's annual Black Light Bash Bingo was held at the Marion Knights of Columbus Hall in Marion, Illinois. The event benefitted the Salvation Army of Southern Illinois. Under the purple haze of black lights, players dressed up in glowing hats and t-shirts and daubed their Bingo sheets with glowing daubers as they competed for more than \$1,000 in cash prizes. Pull tabs, a 50/50 drawing, a ticket auction and a cash bar were also part of the festivities. The Salvation Army used the funds from the event to support various services including its food pantry, and to provide financial assistance to struggling families by helping with utility bills.

NC Newspaper Bingo Feature

A lot of lucky people won a share of \$3,000 in cash prizes including a \$2,000 grand prizefrom the Greenville, North Carolina, Daily Reflector's recent print edition Bingo game. The fun began when all home delivery subscribers received a unique Bingo card in their Sunday papers. Each day following, a number was drawn and published in the paper until a grand-prize winner was declared. There were nine ways to win: first diagonal, first horizontal, first vertical, first to win designated letters, first to cover all four corners, and first to get a coverall—which won the \$2,000 top prize.

PTO Turns to Bingo

A Bingo fundraiser organized by the Parent-Teacher Organization of Madison Elementary School in Madison, West Virginia, raised more than \$20,000 to benefit students. Most Bingo prizes were donated and roughly 550 players attended the event. The money will go toward funding field trips, computer software, extra classroom supplies, and the school's sound system. It will also funds arts projects, a math field day and the school's annual academic bowl. This marked the fourth year of the event, which was begun after area schools experienced major budget cuts, requiring creative alternatives to generate new funding while fostering community involvement with the school.

Bingo Machine Blues

Hi Guy,


I always enjoy reading about some of the issues that you write about in your column and wanted to share something that I just experienced and ask for your comments.

Last Friday, I went to my local Bingo hall where I have played Bingo for many years. I was in line to purchase my Bingo machine and paper. The lady in front of me asked for a machine with five packages on it, and the cashier walked over to the counter where the machines are stacked.

There were three machines in the stack, he lifted the top machine and gave her the middle one. I noted this, as I always purchase five packages on the machine, and thought: "That should have been my machine...I hope it is not a winner!"

Well, the bonus coverall came up, and indeed the lady won \$500 as the consolation prize since she won in more than the

specified minimum numbers for the jackpot. She happened to be sitting opposite me at the next table, which really made it very noticeable!

Obviously, I have bad feelings over this. I know the Bingo manager casually, as well as the cashier, but would not mention it to them as I do not want any bad feelings with them. I certainly love to play Bingo there as it is close to my home.

Interestingly, I have tried to purchase Bingo paper from floor workers both at this hall and larger casino halls, but they do not want to sell paper when you walk up to them. They say they will get to you and need to sell the paper in the order of their route around the floor-that it causes problems with players if they see a change in the sequence. — Disappointed in Phoenix, Arizona

Hi Disappointed,

This is a very interesting situation and one that in all my years penning this column I don't believe anyone has ever written in about.

To summarize your complaint, you feel that the machine given to the other player should have been yours because it was the second in a stack of three and you were second in line after this player. But for some reason the cashier pulled the second machine from the stack and gave it to the woman in front of you, and she won \$500 with it.

The moment the cashier picked up the machine, you say you felt it should have been yours. When the woman won, you believed, and still believe, that she had been awarded your prize money.

You further underscore your point by noting that when floor workers sell Bingo paper, they try to only sell it in sequence following a specific route through the hall-your point being that the Bingo machines were in a stack of three and should also only be distributed in sequence, and if that had been done, you would have received your machine and won your \$500.

First off, let me say that you would have made an excellent attorney! You built your case based on the facts as you saw them (how the machines were being handed out), as well as providing expanded information (how floor workers sell Bingo paper) to further bolstered your case. Nice job!

To me, the question here is: Does it make a difference which machine you get?

My answer is no. Bingo machines are like electronic viewers that display and track your virtual Bingo paper. It is not the machine itself that determines your cards. Your cards get loaded into the general system once you've bought into the game and you monitor your cards through the handheld.

The woman in line in front of you paid the fee and got her five packs, which were coded into the machine. You were next, paid your fee and got a different handheld to view your packs.

The machine the cashier skipped may have been dirty, damaged, old...there could be any number of reasons why he took the next one instead. The important thing is, it really doesn't make a difference which machine you get-unless you feel one machine is "luckier" than another, which is whole different issue! -Guy

Your iPhone

The Department of Veterans Affairs has partnered with Apple to let us access our health records right from our iPhone. This information will include not only the health care we get from the VA, but from other medical providers as well.

If you've ever looked at the Health app on your iPhone, you've seen that it's comprehensive. With the VA partnership with Apple, you'll be able to look up lab results and check prescriptions, shot records and more, right on your phone.

It will work with third-party apps to keep track of every healthy (or unhealthy) thing you do. It will remind you to take your pills or check your glucose. It will track your sleep cycles and wake you

• The software will periodically connect your phone to the various medical servers and bring in any new records.

• To keep your medical data safe, you'll need to use Face ID, a passcode or Touch ID, whether or not you want it. Are you certain that no one else knows your passcode?

• The app includes an unencrypted emergency Medical ID card that EMTs (and anyone else) can use to check your health info.

• We don't know that third-party provider apps are safe.

Check your iPhone if you have one. The default setting is to track your walking distance, flights climbed and steps taken. You might have years of data on your phone without knowing it.

He opted to receive that prize in the form of a one-time payment of \$650,000 before taxes. At press time, three \$4 million prizes and seven additional \$1 million prizes were still available in the \$4,000,000 Instant Jackpot game.



Who's In Charge?

Dear Aunt Bingo:

I have gotten a little frustrated by how a local Indian Nation Bingo is operated. I'm not saying that there's anything fishy going on no cheating or anything like that but I do feel that the games could be operated better, the staff could be more involved, and the people who run it could make more of an effort to make the games an enjoyable, professional, organized experience.

I remember reading in one of your articles about someone complaining about the rules not being enforced, or looking like they are being enforced for some players and not others, and you said that the games are monitored by the state's gaming commission or gambling board or something like that.

Having such a regulator strikes me as a very good idea, because we are talking about games and money being exchanged and such a thing really requires monitoring. But I believe Indian Nations are considered separate from the states where they are located and for the most part govern themselves.

I would like to know, therefore, if Indian casinos are regulated by a commission or board or someone else who a person can contact if they have a complaint. — Amy Y., via email

Dear Amy:

According to the National Congress of American Indians, there are 566 federally recognized Indian Nations in the United States. The U.S. Constitution recognizes that Indian Nations are sovereign governments and possess the inherent powers of self-government. Treaties and laws have created a fundamental contract between Indian Nations and the United States: Indian Nations ceded millions of acres of land that made the United States what it is today, and in return received, among other guarantees, the right of continued selfgovernment on their own lands.

Tribal self-government serves the same purpose today as it always has: ensuring that Indian Nations remain viable as distinct groups of people. Tribal cultures enrich American life, and tribal economies provide opportunities where few would otherwise exist. Tribal governments also provide basic infrastructure, including roads, bridges and public buildings and a broad range of governmental services on tribal lands, including education, law enforcement, judicial systems and environmental protection.

I assume that Bingo and other gaming on Indian Nation lands falls within this same area of selfgovernment and self-regulation. As such, I believe that any complaints or concerns about their operation would have to be directed to the management team of the facility and to the leaders of the Nation. — *Aunt Bingo*

How to Create a Family Health Portrait

Dear Savvy Senior,

How do I go about making a family health history? Most of my relatives have died before age 65, so my doctor recently suggested I create a family history to help identify my own genetic vulnerabilities. — *Approaching* **50**

Dear Approaching,

This is a very good idea. An accurate family health history remains one of the most important tools in keeping yourself healthy as you age, and the holidays when family members come together is a great time to do it. Here's what you should know, along with some tips and tools to help you create one.

Know Your Genes

Just as you can inherit your father's height or your mother's eye color, you can also inherit their genetic risk for diseases like cancer, diabetes, heart disease and more. If one generation of a family has high blood pressure, for example, it is not unusual for the next generation to have it too. Therefore, tracing the illnesses suffered by your relatives can help you and your doctor predict the disorders you may be at risk for, so you can take action to keep yourself healthy.

To create a family health history, you'll need to start by collecting some basic medical information on your first-degree relatives including your parents, siblings and children. Then move on to your grandparents, aunts, uncles and first cousins.

You need to get the specific ages of when they developed health problems like heart disease, cancer, diabetes, arthritis, dementia, depression, etc. If family members are deceased, you need to know when and how they died. If possible, include lifestyle information as well, such as diet, exercise, smoking and alcohol use.

Some relatives may not want to share their medical histories, or they may not know their family history, but whatever information you discover will be helpful.

One way to get information on a relative who has passed is a copy of their death certificate. This will list their cause of death and the age he or she died. To get a death certificate, contact the vital records office in the state where your relative died, or go to <u>VitalChek.com</u>. Or, if you were adopted, the National Foster Care & Adoption Directory Search (see <u>ChildWelfare.gov/nfcad</u>) may be able to help you locate your birth parents so you can get their medical history.

Helpful Tools

To get help putting together your family health history, the U.S. Surgeon General created a free web-based tool called "My Family Health Portrait" (see <u>phgkb.cdc.gov/FHH/html</u>) that can help you collect, organize and understand your genetic risks and even share the information with your family members and doctors.

Another good resource that provides similar assistance is the Genetic Alliance's online tool called "Does It Run In the Family." At <u>FamilyHealthHistory.org</u> you can create a customized guide on your family health history for free.

Handling the Results

If you uncover some serious health risks that run in your family, don't despair. While you can't change your genes, you can change your habits to increase your chances of a healthy future. By eating a healthy diet, exercising and not smoking, you can offset and sometimes even neutralize your genetic vulnerabilities. This is especially true for heart disease, stroke, type-2 diabetes and osteoporosis.

A family medical history can also alert you to get early and frequent screening tests, which can help detect other problems (high blood pressure, high cholesterol, and cancers like breast, ovarian, prostrate and colon cancer) in their early stages when they're most treatable.



Tricky Hand Presents a Dilemma on the River

By Jonathan Little

In a recent \$3,500-buy-in World Poker Tour event, I found myself totally lost on the river in a difficult hand.

Blinds were at 300-600 with a 600 big blind ante. Action folded to my opponent, a middle-aged guy who had yet to get out of line. He raised to 1,200. I called 600 more from the big blind with Qd Jh. I could have three-bet but didn't think he was likely to fold due to his strong preflop range, and I'm not a fan of playing hands that can be easily dominated from out of position.

The flop came Qh Qc 10s, giving me trips.

I checked, and my opponent

made a continuation bet of 1,500. I check-raised to 3,900. I don't like check-calling here because it makes it tough to play a large pot on the turn and river. My opponent's range to call a turn or river check-raise is much tighter than his range to call a flop checkraise. He called 2,400 more.

The turn was the 8s. I bet 5,800. I thought that he would almost certainly fold small pairs, A-K and A-J at this point, and that he would continue with A-A, K-K, J-J, 8-8, K-J, J-9 or, of course, the missing Q. Betting was a better option than checking, because checking allows him to see a free card with his draws while also allowing him to value-bet when he has me beat. He called.

The river was the Ah. This was a terrible card for me because now A-A and K-J would beat me, and I wouldn't be able to get additional value from K-K. If I bet small, my opponent would call with all hands that beat me. He'd probably fold all pairs worse than an aces. If he had A-K or A-J (unlikely), he'd probably call a river bet.

If I bet large, perhaps 18,000, he'd inevitably call when I'm beat and fold when I'm ahead. He'd maybe even find a big fold with a hand such as Q-9 or A-K. I couldn't make a big bet without having seen an overly aggressive dynamic from my opponent, and he hadn't shown me that.

If I checked the river and my opponent made any sort of reasonable bet, would it be better to call or fold? If he could have A-K or A-J in his range, I should probably call, assuming he'd

will come close to the theoretical 99.54% return for the game (assuming you play every hand perfectly).

A friend of mine ran a computer simulation of fifty sessions of play, each session consisting of 7,200 hands (playing 9/6 Jacks or Better). (That's 360,000 hands, about a year's worth of play.) The result of the simulation was this: 16 sessions were winners (32%) and 34 were losers (68%). (This comes close to my experience of losing two out of every three playing sessions.)

Bottom line is this for video poker-even when you play every hand perfectly, in the short run you will experience losing streaks although in the long run you can win money (especially when you take advantage of a casino's cash back and bounce back promotions). So if losing sessions and streaks are inevitable, how do we muddle our way through them? Here are some tips based on my playing experience. • Have the mindset going in that most of your sessions will be losers. This means that you shouldn't be upset when you lose. (That's a tough thing to get used to, but if losing stresses you out then you really shouldn't be playing video poker.) • Have enough bankroll set aside to play video poker, especially when those inevitable losing streaks occur.

value-bet those hands. If he would check behind with those hands, I should be much more inclined to check-fold.

I also had to figure out if my opponent would turn hands such as K-K, J-J, J-10 or J-9 into a bluff on the river. If so, it would probably be best for me to checkcall, which would likely be the only way to extract value.

This was a difficult spot because my hand looked like either trips or a straight, which would never fold, or a 10 that would fold to any bet. That means it would have been fairly crazy for my opponent to bluff with a hand such as K-K or J-J, because I don't think he could expect me to fold most of my possible hands to a bet.

If I checked and he bet, I would assume it was a value bet with a hand that could beat my trips, allowing me to safely fold. It's not often that you find a spot to easily check-fold trips on the river, but this had the potential to be one.

Unfortunately, I made the mistake of betting 7,500. My opponent happily called with J-9 and took down a big pot.

pay bills. (If you play with the mortgage or rent money, the constant worry of how to pay your bills when losing streaks occur will be devastating.)

• Take full advantage of a casino's benefits and promotions. For example, schedule your playtime during promotions that multiply the points you earn for playing (the bigger the multiplier, the better). This extra money that you earn from being a member of a player's club will decrease the losses from playing. In fact, most smart video poker players (me included) play video poker games that we know in the long term will be losers (because our return is less than 100%, even playing perfectly) but the cash we get from casino promotions exceeds the losses from playing, leaving a net profit. • Play video poker games that have a low variance, like 9/6 Jacks or Better, and 8/5 Bonus Poker. The lower the variance, the less bankroll you will need to weather those negative short-term losing streaks. • If you find yourself in the midst of a losing streak, take a break, go home, and check your playing accuracy on a software trainer. (Be sure you are not making playing mistakes.) At the minimum, always take along a strategy card when you play so you will have the correct playing strategy for any hand readily available.

poker sessions, even though I've come out ahead ten out of the past twelve years that I've played video poker. You might find that strange, especially when the video poker games I mostly play have returns in the range of 99.5 to 99.7% (i.e., slightly less than 100%). That's because even when you play each hand perfectly, you can still expect to win nothing 54.54% of the time; furthermore, 21.46% of the time you will only break even (when you bet five coins and end up with a high pair, you only get back five coins). Therefore, 76% of the time, you will gain nothing because the big payoffs occur infrequently in video poker; therefore, you are more likely to have more losing than winning sessions, although in the long run, your winning sessions will wipe out most (but not all) of your losses and you




