SEARCHING FOR THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN

The well-known story of Solomon using his newfound wisdom to determine a baby's true mother by proposing to cut the baby in two occurs just a few verses after the passage



we hear in today's reading. Note, however, that Solomon did not specifically ask God for wisdom. He asked God simply for an understanding heart. Also notice that he did not ask for an understanding mind, but

an understanding heart, so that he could know in his heart what is right. God then gives him "a heart so wise and understanding" (1 Kings 3:12) that he gains the wisdom to distinguish right from wrong and make just judgments.

Again this week Jesus uses parables to describe the kingdom of heaven. The act of buying a field in which you've just reburied a treasure seems strange and a little deceptive, but in the uncertain political situation of Jesus' time, and especially at a time when the Gospels were written, hiding a treasure underground was not uncommon. The parable's point is that the finder gives everything he has to gain that treasure. So must we be willing to do to gain the treasure of heaven.

Not once in all the parables that we have heard over the last few Sundays has Jesus mentioned wisdom. Yet wisdom is essential to reach the prop-

er conclusions. Wisdom teaches us to reach true treasure, which may be overlooked by most people, buried deep inside someone, hidden away from those who see superficially. It is wisdom that gives the




finder an understanding heart to make the right judgment and value the treasure of its true worth.




