HERC Update	<ul> <li>The HERC recently completed a regional MCI drill modelled after the Las Vegas shootings. The After Action Report is being completed and will be posted.</li> <li>The State is considering hosting an ACS Disaster Management and Emergency Preparedness and is asking if there is interest.</li> <li>An Advanced HAZMAT Life Support provider course is TENTATIVELY set for December 11 &amp; 12 in the Wausau area.</li> <li>Bert Nitzke has been hired as the WISCOM subject matter expert.</li> <li>The Regional Medical Coordination Center plan is still being developed and Robbie hopes to have a draft done in November.</li> <li>Robbie is continuing to work on the regional response plan.</li> </ul>
State Trauma/ STAC	<ul> <li>The RTACs have not received our fiscal contracts yet.</li> <li>The next STAC meeting will be December 5.</li> <li>The DHS OPEHC office released a statement recently stating that they will not endorse SALT/MUCC as a preferred triage algorithm. The group discussed this and felt that the next encouragement to adopt SALT/MUCC should come from medical directors. The region has already provided MUCC-compliant triage tags/kits to all ambulance services</li> </ul>
State EMS Update	<ul> <li>The section is fully staffed. They will have a part-time person to help with the dispatch CPR project.</li> <li>The section recently completed license renewals. Ray thanked everyone for their patience with the process. They are working with ImageTrend to improve the system and speed it up.</li> <li>The next EMS Advisory Board and committee meetings will be October 16 &amp; 17.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Work continues on the flexible staffing and community integrated healthcare.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Stop the Bleed classes are continuing. Michael applied for a grant from WPS for additional kits but was unsuccessful. Emily has applied to the Aspirus Foundation.</li> <li>Michael's email will be changing to <u>Michael.Fraley@NCRTAC-WI.org</u>.</li> <li>Michael conducted hospital trauma site visits with St. Mary's, Sacred Heart, Howard Young and Eagle River. He attended Oneida and Clark County EMS/Fire Chief meetings.</li> <li>Michael is working on scheduling meetings for next year using the same 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of odd months. Dates and locations will be posted as soon as possible.</li> <li>Reminder that free PHTLS and Trauma First Response books are available as are three host-site stipends of \$300. Greenwood is hosting a Trauma First Responder course in November.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Process Improvement         <ul> <li>Had a good meeting last time with Eric and looked at several reports.</li> <li>Group is not in favor of WI adding isolated extremity (hip) fractures to the registry.</li> <li>Sara developed a form to record take-away points from PI case reviews and will use it to help track follow up as needed.</li> <li>Will review hospital activation criteria today.</li> <li>Tina S. presented a case</li> </ul> </li> <li>Definitive Care         <ul> <li>No meeting</li> </ul> </li> <ul> <li>Michael will be working on updating the Trauma Basics course</li> <li>Continuing support of Stop the Bleed courses and kit placement</li> </ul> <li>Injury prevention         <ul> <li>No meeting</li> </ul> </li> <li>Definition</li> <li>No meeting</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li><u>EMS training for nurses</u> – skills that might be needed by ED staff when a patient comes in w/o EMS (splinting, spinal immobilization, extrication from a car)</li> <li>EMS crew came up and did body mechanics training</li> <li>Keep long backboard in the ED bay</li> <li>ER skills day</li> </ul>
Other business	<ul> <li>Discussion about ED provider (including mid-level) ATLS requirements. Michael will send the state FAQ to hospitals.</li> </ul>
