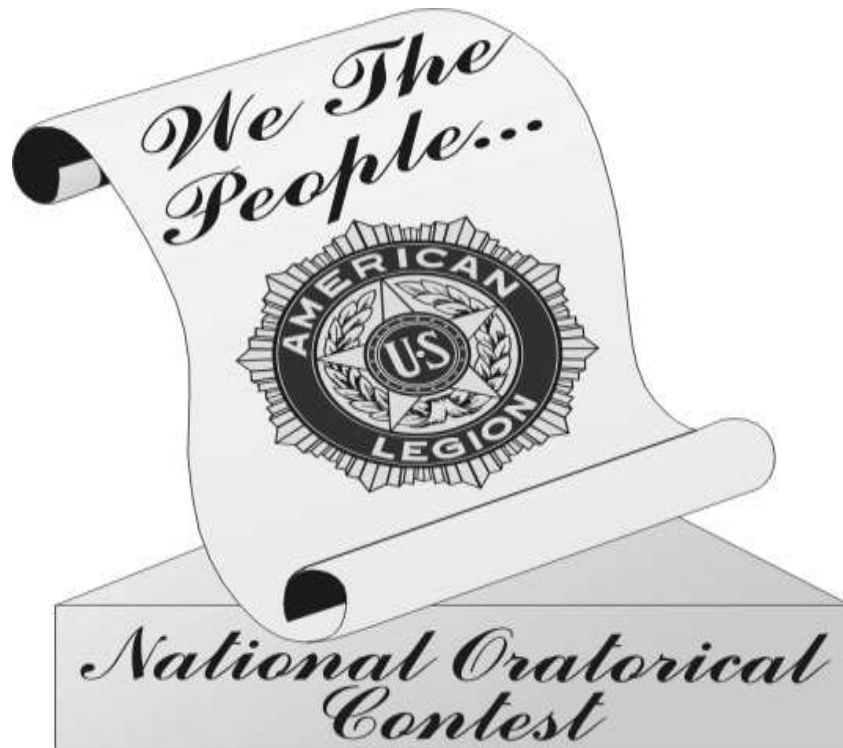

American Legion Oratorical Contest

American Legion Post #403 is again sponsoring the local Post American Legion Oratorical Contest. Community high school age students, **grades 9-12, are eligible to participate for Post scholarship awards. Post 403 Contest Application Registration deadline is November 9, 2020. Application and written copy of Prepared Oration must be submitted by the deadline date. The Post Contest will be held November 14, 2020 starting at 9:00 a.m. at Post 403 building.**

First Place:	\$500.00**
Second Place:	\$400.00
Third Place:	\$300.00
Fourth Place:	\$200.00
Fifth Place	\$100.00

**The First Place winner or replacement (if first place winner unable to continue) will receive an additional \$200 if they participate in the County American Legion contest to be held between December 7, 2020 and December 20, 2020 and another \$300 if they proceed to participate in the District American Legion Contest to be held between December 21, 2020 and January 10, 2021.

The National High School Oratorical contest sponsored since 1938 by the American Legion is designed to instill a greater knowledge and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States in high school students. Other objectives include the development of leadership, the ability to think and speak clearly, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship. Another purpose of the program is to assist students in paying the high cost of college education.

The Post (community level) competition is the beginning step to the final culmination in the National competition. The student advances from the Post level, county level, district level (there are 9 Legion districts in the state of Iowa), area level (comprised of each district's first and second place contestants), department level (State competition comprised of 3 area level winners), and finally the national level in which the student competes against winners from other states at Indiana University – Purdue University in Indianapolis, IN.

Scholarships Awarded beyond the Post Competition are:

County Scholarship Award:	TBD by American Legion Dallas County Officers.
District Scholarship Award:	District Champions eliminated in the Area contests will receive a scholarship prize of \$200 with same restrictions as Department finals.
Area Scholarship Award:	Each participant in Area Contest will receive \$50 from Dept. of Iowa for expenses.
Department (Iowa) Scholarship Award:	First Place: \$2000.00 Second Place: \$1500.00 Third Place: \$1000.00
National Scholarship Award:	First Place: \$25,000.00 Second Place: \$22,500.00 Third Place: \$20,000.00

There are two sections to the contest at District level and higher. These sections are the Prepared Oration section and the Assigned Topic section. **The subject to be used for the Prepared Oration must be on some phase of the Constitution of the United States which will give emphasis to the attendant duties and obligations of a citizen to our government.** The Prepared Oration must be the original effort of each contestant and must not take less than eight (8) minutes or more than ten (10) minutes for delivery. The Assigned Topic section of the contest must not consume less than three (3) minutes or more than five (5) minutes for delivery. **There are four different Assigned Topics that relate to specific sections of the Constitution. These specific topics are rotated from year to year by the National American Legion. At the Post level competition, the Post has elected to have the contestant prepare for only two of the four National assigned topics. The Assigned Topics for Post 403 competition for 2020/2021 are: (1) Article II, Section 3 and (2) Article III, Section 1.** Specific wording on these two topics can be found on the Department website – www.ialegion.org The student will not know which of the two Assigned Topics he/she will have to address until it is given to the student by a contest official approximately five (5) minutes prior to the time of the contestant's delivery.
