



Oregon Survey Results

Q1 This November, there will be a ballot measure that would amend the Oregon Constitution to allow 50% of net lottery proceeds to be distributed by each of the Oregon counties, rather than by the Oregon state legislature. A 'yes' vote requires distribution of 50% of lottery net proceeds to counties for specified public purposes (economic development, education, natural resources), plus public safety. A 'no' vote retains legislative appropriation of 100% of lottery net proceeds for specified public purposes (economic development, education, natural resources), not public safety. Counties shall use these funds for the same currently specified purposes, plus public safety. Having heard this, would you vote 'yes' or 'no' on the ballot measure?

Q2 In your opinion, what is the highest-priority need for public funding in your county: economic development, public safety, public education, parks and natural resources, or something else?

Q4 Who would you trust more to distribute the net profits from the Oregon lottery system: the county commissioners in your county or the state legislature?

County commissioners..... 55%
State legislature 25%
Not sure 20%

Q5 If you are a woman, press 1. If a man, press 2.

Woman 53%
Man..... 47%

Q6 If you are a Democrat, press 1. If a Republican, press 2. If you are an independent or identify with another party, press 3.

Democrat..... 38%
Republican..... 38%
Independent/Other..... 24%

Q7 If you are white, press 1. If other, press 2.

White 85%
Other..... 15%

Q8 If you are 18 to 29 years old, press 1. If 30 to 45, press 2. If 46 to 65, press 3. If you are older than 65, press 4.

18 to 29..... 9%
30 to 45..... 24%
46 to 65..... 42%
Older than 65..... 25%



Q9 If you live in the Portland area, press 1. If the Eugene area, press 2. If the Bend area, press 3. If the Medford area, press 4. If you live somewhere else, press 5.

<i>Portland area</i>	32%
<i>Eugene area</i>	11%
<i>Bend area</i>	4%
<i>Medford area</i>	9%
<i>Somewhere else</i>	44%
