

Funeral Services For War Veteran

Former Elkton Resident; Served
With U .S. Marines in France

Funeral services were held at ten o'clock a. m. Wednesday in St. Francis Catholic Church, Pigeon, for Frank Bursick, 48, who passed away Saturday in Milwaukee after an illness of several years. Fr. A. P. Hafner officiated. Burial was in the church cemetery in charge of Tip-of-The-Thumb Post No. 2236, Veterans of Foreign Wars. 2236 V. F. W.

Born February 6, 1892, Mr. Bursick served in the United State's Marine Corps for eight years and was overseas during the World War. He was living at the home of his brother, Vincent Bursick in Detroit at the time he was taken ill. He entered the Veteran's Hospital in Wood's, Milwaukee, where he has been a patient for the past eleven years.
