Lighthouse Quilt Guild General Meeting Minutes

February 26th, 2018 at 7pm

President Pat Henningfeld called the meeting to order.

Announcements: New members and guests were welcomed. Betty Suiter was welcomed back after time away, and Sharon Matusevicius was in attendance after suffering a fall in the past month.

Program: Ginger Wanserski informed the group that the night's speaker, Joan Cain, had suffered a fractured hip within the last couple of days, so the intended program, "Honey, Let's go to Home Depot"had to be canceled. Instead, using the money that would have otherwise been spent on the speaker, \$10 Sew N Save gift cards were awarded to those that could answer quilting trivia questions.

Business: Ginger Wanserski passed around a notebook to gather get well wishes for Joan Cain. If interested, sign-up and pay for the next two workshops – March 27th with Kirsten Weiss, and April 30th with Lisa Binkley. The March "Landscape Quilting" workshop kit fee is waived since there is sufficient interest. Bring fabric to share. The April workshop "Bead Embellishment Design on Quilts" is \$45 with a \$35 kit fee. Both are held at the Mount Pleasant Lutheran Church. Pat Henningfeld reminded everyone that there is still a need for quilt show committee leader(s). Without a leader stepping forward soon there won't be a quilt show in 2019. Without a quilt show in 2019 the funds in the bank will have to last until the next show in 2021, which could impact the quality of speakers that can be brought in for guild meetings. See Pat if you're interested in being the chair or co-chair. You can order a name tag from Pat Henningfeld for \$3.50. Shout out was given to Maria Rivest and Sharon Matusevicius for doing a great job on the newsletter.

Door prizes: Pat Brown provided a variety of door prizes for those whose name was drawn. She reminded the group to pick up your membership card from her and noted that a beginner quilter is looking for a mentor, so let her know if you're interested in being a mentor.

Pat Henningfeld noted that on guild nights the door to the church will be locked so someone needs to be at the door from 5:45pm to 7:00pm to let guild members in. Arrivals after 7:00pm will need to enter on the back side of the building, the doors that enter into the meeting room. It was agreed that those on the hospitality committee that month, since they arrive early anyway, will rotate being at the door. Pat Henningfeld said that 3 Kenosha Unified teachers were interested in a mini grant, for which \$250 is allotted. With the money they teach students sewing skills, make baby bibs, quilts, and other items for the community. She asked if the guild would consider increasing the budget to \$300 so that each teacher could receive \$100. Kathy Lijewski raised the motion, Barbara Vallone seconded the motion, a vote was taken and the motion passed. Dianna Zimmerman introduced the Hospitality committee.

Show and Tell: A nice variety of quilts were shown.

Next board meeting is March 5th, 7pm at Lutheran Church of the Resurrection.

The meeting adjourned at 8:07pm. Refreshments were served.

FEATURED PLACES OF INTEREST

Over Land, Under Cover: Tales of Quilts & Coverlets and their Journeys to Wisconsin, 1830-1880

Saturday, January 27, 2018 - Sunday, May 6, 2018

Uncover the stories beneath bed covers brought to Wisconsin by early settlers to the state and learn how these mementos of life back home were made. Quilts and coverlets, two popular forms of mid-19th-century bed coverings, traveled to Wisconsin with settlers from the eastern United States as they trekked west to the newly-formed territory and later state. Not only did these covers keep their owners warm during cold Wisconsin nights, but they also held sentimental memories of home and those left behind. This exhibit looks at the journeys made by a number of quilts and coverlets in the collections of the Wisconsin Historical Society and the stories they tell about those who owned them. It will also touch on the craft and history surrounding these two types of bed coverings.

STRIP PIECING AT RESURRECTION!


