
Thank You for Your Colorado Gives Day Donations!



Broomfield Community Players: Spring Update

Like theatres all over the world, the work of the Broomfield Community Players (BCP) came to an abrupt halt in early spring as the COVID-19 pandemic swept across the globe forcing in-person entertainment to cease. This compelled BCP to rethink what kind of theatre was possible. Already having cancelled plans for a New Play Festival and a late summer full-length show, the players did not want to cancel their holiday show as well.

When we learned in March the Broomfield Auditorium would be closed for the foreseeable future but was gearing up for live streaming and/or recording, we decided to produce a virtual holiday show without admission as a gift to the community. Max Cabot was selected as director and his vision was to find actors who would develop their own holiday-related scripts from personal experience. The actors would tell their stories and be recorded at the auditorium in small groups and the recordings would be edited later to complete the show.

Cast selection, story development and virtual rehearsals began in October and filming at the auditorium was completed in mid-November.



Considerable time was spent editing the performances and stitching the stories together into a coherent and provocative program. On December 18, we debuted Virtually Christmas, A Few Untold Stories.

Director, Max Cabot, said, "These stories were told beautifully by our remarkable cast and embraced all the crazy mixture of emotions that can accompany the holiday season." Performers included Steve Blount, Theresa Collins, Sam Gilstrap, Beth Lietaert, Wade Livingston, Kelli Oberndorf, Leslie Seabolt, and AJ Voliton.

We had more than 250 "hits" on our Facebook broadcast. While we had hoped for more, we felt the show was a success for our first foray into video production. Plans for future performances remain uncertain as all of us continue to respond to the realities of life in a pandemic. Like everyone in the theatre, we long for the day when we can gather for rehearsal, prepare a show and welcome an audience once again!



BackStory Theatre's There will be Light

BackStory Theatre is delighted to announce the inaugural production of our new adult programming wing, Wellspring! Wellspring is dedicated to creating an inclusive, supportive space for adult performers and creatives with informational and support meetings, artist salons to explore new ideas and emerging works, and by featuring the work of historically marginalized authors. Our first production is a new musical called "There Will Be Light" written by a talented, BIPOC, LGBTQ member of our staff with an all-female production team.

"There Will Be Light" delves into such serious topics as bullying, sexual violence, and teen suicide, and will be best suited to audiences aged 14+. The main character, high schooler Max James, is grappling with his small town and classmate's intolerance to his homosexuality and how that constantly collides with issues of religion and personal growth and understanding for all involved. Ultimately, the characters of the play realize that even in the darkest of times, someday, there will be light.

A message from the author, Preston Adams: "The concept of "There Will Be Light" came to me while I was in college. The musical is a hybrid of my own life story and experience and depicts, through the eyes of the characters, my personal sociological and psychological observations of the world. My intent is for people who usually have difficulties feeling seen and heard to see themselves represented in a show, and hopefully feel as if they have a voice. I also hope that after seeing "There Will Be Light" the audience will be more receptive to conversations regarding mental health and sexuality.



I have always loved musical theater and was particularly intrigued by shows like Rent, Bare, Spring Awakening, & Stop Kiss that portray homosexual relationships in a respectful and poignant manner. However, none of these great shows really told the story of being an African-American homosexual. My story. Therefore, I wanted my central characters, Ethan and Max, to relay the struggle of not only coming out, but living life as a gay black youth. Max, who is an African-American character, is my personification of the latter. It was extremely important to me to create a show that centered around a realistic black character - not as a caricature of what people think a black person is, regardless of sexuality - but as an actual character with a journey arc and feelings. My other central character, Ethan, represents the juxtaposition of what it's like struggling with sexual identity in a situation that doesn't allow a person to explore and grow fully into themself. Ethan is a culmination of so many people I've interacted with in my adult life, the situations I've been in with them, and the journey I've witnessed them go through. I believe all my characters, in one way or another, examine how external factors can affect an internal struggle and the possible end results. So, it was also important to include instances of bullying in the musical. More often than not, kids going through the discovery process of their sexual identity are deemed "different" and almost always encounter someone who is non-supportive, even resistant or downright appalling to this process - especially to those that seem more "feminine" or "weak" in comparison.

In conclusion, this show, a story that became way more autobiographical than originally intended, is a dedication to those who have felt different, discarded, or excluded for being who they are. I would like to note that the title and namesake song of "There Will Be Light" is based on a personal poem I wrote while processing the death of a very close friend. When I had finished, I knew that this poem of overcoming grief needed to be the basis for my show. I am proud of this show and I'm so glad that I could honor my late friend in such a way. So last, I would like to dedicate "There Will Be Light" to my good friend: Samuel Henline."


Join the One Book One Broomfield Committee



Broomfield Spellbinders

Although Spellbinders volunteer storytellers have been unable to enjoy face-to-face, heart-to-heart interaction with our listeners for almost a year, we have continued to share our love of stories and to hone our telling skills in a number of ways. By using Zoom, we have continued our monthly meetings (except for our usual summer hiatus) and held monthly, rather than quarterly, Story Circles that allow our volunteers to try out new stories and receive peer feedback. Additionally, on December 12, we ventured into the (for us) uncharted waters of a webinar in which six of our tellers participated in the holiday event, "Stories for the Season."

With the support of teachers who have had to overcome myriad technical challenges, many of our storytellers have been able to share stories with students "virtually" in the many settings (at home, in classrooms, and the "hybrid" model that combines those two) where education has occurred during the past year. We have maintained contact with all the teachers who have welcomed us into their classrooms in the past and look forward to rejoining them when life is back to "normal."

We have also enlarged the Steering Committee that plans and organizes our monthly meetings and other activities, gathers and analyzes data, handles administrative duties, and provides guidance and support to all members. The new members are Sheila Brush, Ellen Klement, Cathy Lichty (who also serves as Chair of the Spellbinders Council of Trustees), and Denny Thompson (back after a brief "sabbatical").

At year-end, we initiated a "Six Word Challenge" that invited our members to describe in exactly six words "What storytelling means to me." We received 24 responses and then asked members to choose their three favorites. Here are the results with the names of the authors:

1. Connecting with children feeds my soul. (Cathy Lichty)

- 2. Preserving old stories; creating new ones. (Wynn Montgomery)
- 3. Spreading joy, one story after another. (Julie Toepper)

Linda Bolander — Originally attempting to play the violin at age three with a toy guitar and a stick from the back yard, Linda finally convinced her mother to let her play in fifth grade when it was offered through the public schools (with a violin that actually worked). Since then, she has earned a BA in Music from Metropolitan State University of Denver and an MA in Creative Writing from CU Boulder. Linda has taught both music and writing and continues to work with students passing on her love of music.



Chippy Cianci — Chippy grew up in New Jersey, moved to Colorado in 1974, and then to Broomfield in 1989. She ran a licensed childcare service from her home while raising her two children. When her children were involved with the popular Broomfield Summer Youth Players program, Chippy became a volunteer in Broomfield's art scene and has remained a strong advocate assisting with organizing events, such as Broomstock. She works as a Property Transfer Technician for the City and County of Broomfield Assessor Department and holds a BS in Natural Resources Management from CSU. Chippy has traveled extensively and worked overseas. She was also the 2015 recipient of the Heart of Broomfield Award for the Arts.



Carolyn Crouse — Carolyn, a Broomfield resident since 1971, graduated from Broomfield High School in 1980. In the spring of her senior year, she was the first vocalist from a Broomfield choir to be chosen to the Colorado All State Choir. She is a dedicated vocal performer with the Broomfield Women's Astor Choir directed by Dr. Tina Lynn-Craig and also performs as a duet with her partner singer/songwriter/guitarist, Patrick O'Kelly. Carolyn has also run a private piano studio in her house since 1998. She is the President of the Broomfield Music Teachers Association and has several students play in the Annual Broomfield Piano Festival. She is a wife, mother of 3 and grandmother of five and loves needle arts and cats. She was also the 2020 recipient of the Heart of Broomfield Award for the Arts.



Heather Doran — Heather Doran joined BCAH in 2017 and is the Program Director of Broomfield Film Project, a BCAH program. She worked as a location scout and manager for 18 years in Seattle, finding locations and managing set logistics for studio films including "Life or Something Like It" starring Angelina Jolie, "The Ring" starring Naomi Watts, "Get Carter" starring Sylvester Stallone, and "Solaris" starring George Clooney. Now a digital marketer in Colorado, she enjoys supporting arts and science events, ideating fundraising strategies with the board, and introducing Colorado films to Colorado audiences.



Kathy Klatt — When Kathy isn't volunteering for BCAH, she is spending time with her beloved grandchildren. For decades, Kathy was a treasured and favorited Broomfield Children's Librarian who was responsible for much of the Library's creative programming for children and families, such as Wonderful Wednesdays/Fabulous Fridays and Día de los Niño's/Libros. She was also the 2008 recipient of the Heart of Broomfield Award for the Arts. She retired a few years ago to focus on her family, serve as the liaison for Chadash Contemporary Dance Movement, and volunteer for BCAH.

Dr. Christina Lynn-Craig — "Dr. Tina," a past Heart of Broomfield for Arts recipient, has been involved with BCAH and the Broomfield Music Teachers Association for over 20 years. Dr. Tina founded ASTER Women's Chamber Choir in April of 2000 with the goal of gathering accomplished choral singers who wanted to explore women's lives and music together. Prior to that, she sang with Ars Nova Singers for many years and is a former member of the music faculty and alumna of Loretto Heights College. She received the MM degree from Temple University in Philadelphia and the DMA degree from the University of Colorado (1994), where she was a student of Barbara Doscher and member of the voice faculty. She was also the 2004 recipient of the Heart of Broomfield Award for the Arts. Devoted to contemporary music, Christina has premiered the works of many composers of her generation. Her private voice studio is filled with talented singers of all ages.



Tamara Keshecki — Ms. Keshecki is the Director of Grants and Government Relations at the St. George Theatre Restoration, and the former Founding Executive & Artistic Director of Musical Chairs Chamber Ensemble, Inc. (MCCE), both non-profit arts organizations based in New York City. Keshecki is currently a 2020-21 policy research fellow at Howard J. Samuels State and City Policy, Baruch College's Marxe School of Public and International Affairs studying the differential impact of COVID-19 and federal response policies on nonprofit arts organizations in NYC. She is a research consultant for the Visual Arts Center of New Jersey exploring best practices in providing art therapy via distance learning. Keshecki is a Board Member of the New York Independent Venue Association and a freelance flutist. She holds a Bachelor of Music from New York University, Master of Music in flute performance from New Jersey City University, and Master of Public Policy from University of Massachusetts Amherst. In 2014, she received a New York City Council Citation for her contribution to the cultural community.



Camie Rigirozzi — Camie is a visual artist living in Broomfield, Colorado. She makes mixed media art, plein air paintings, oil paintings, books and cards. She has been working as an artist full time since 2020. Before that, she did art part-time. Camie believes art belongs to everyone. Jane Spain — Jane is a treasured member of the community, a "Living Legend of Dance" awardee through the University of Denver, the founder of Broomfield's first dance studio (Dance Arts Studio, which is now operated by Heidi Thomas), and BCAH's longtime historian. While Jane's position is not an elected position, she is a valued and loved member of BCAH and one of the original advocates for BCAH's formation and the start of art in Broomfield. Jane continues to represent the legacy of BCAH and Broomfield with her friendliness, positive energy, and kindness to everyone. She was also the 2002 recipient of the Heart of Broomfield Award for the Arts.
