# EVERETT'S FATHER-SON TEAM LEADS 2012 AWARD WINNERS

The father-son coach-quarterback team of John DiBiaso and Jonathan DiBiaso from Everett High School becomes the first father - son duo to be honored for their accomplishments by the Jack Grinold Eastern Massachusetts Chapter of the National Football Foundation. The pair, along with 35 other honorees, will be feted at the Chapter's 37th Annual Scholar Athlete Awards Banquet on Monday, May 14, at Lombardo's banquet facility in Randolph, Mass.

John the elder is the winner of the Ed Schluntz Contributions to Amateur Football Award (see related story), while the younger DiBiaso leads the list of 34 2012 Scholar-Athletes selected by the Chapter.

In making the announcement of the award winners, selection Committee chair **Ed Schluntz** noted the difficult decisions that had to be made by the committee.

"We had 50 applications for the 34 slots," Schluntz said. "That's our highest total ever, and the qualifications of the candidates were truly outstanding. While many of the young men met our criteria for selection, this group truly represents the best of the best."

# Bentley's Johnson Named Winner of Innaugural Jack Daly Award



Bentley College quarterback Bryant Johnson has been selected as the first winner of the Jack Daly Award for Academics, Citizenship and Football as presented by the Jack Grinold Eastern Massachusetts Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

"Our selection committee had three outstanding nominees

from which to choose," Chapter President and Executive Director Roger Crosley said. "For the committee to select Bryant is testimony to the type of person he is."

Johnson is the only three-time captain in Bentley football history and has been the starting quarterback all three years. He was a two-time All-Northeast 10 selection, including in 2010 when he was named the NE-10 Offensive Player of the Year. In 2011 he was the recipient of the Swede Nelson Award given for academic and athletic excellence by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston.

# EVERETT COACH DIBIASO HONORED WITH 2012 ED SCHLUNTZ AWARD

DiBiaso has compiled a 198-21 record (.904 winning percentage) in 20 years at the helm of the Crimson Tide including a perfect 12-0 record in 2011 with an Eastern Massachusetts Super Bowl championship. DiBiaso also had Super Bowl Championship teams at Everett in 1997, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2010, and 2011. His teams have won 16 consecutive Greater Boston League titles.

Prior to his time at Everett, DiBiaso was head coach at Weston High School for three years where he earned his first Super Bowl title in 1991 and compiled a 25-15-1 record.

# Curry Coach Bandini To Receive 2012 Ron Burton Award

Curry College Coach and MasterSports founder Skip Bandini has been selected as the 2012 winner of the Ron Burton Distinguished American Award from the Jack

Grinold Eastern Massachusetts Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Bandini's coaching credentials span four decades. A member of the Massachusetts Maritime Academy Athletic Hall of Fame as an offensive lineman, Bandini began his coaching career as a Buccaneer assistant in 1981 under the tutelage of 2011 Burton Award winner **Don Ruggeri**. He had high school head coaching stints at St. Clement and his alma mater Don Bosco, and was an assistant coach at Dom Savio, Stoneham, and Reading high schools.

Bandini moved to the college ranks as offensive coordinator at MIT for three years under 2007 Burton Award winner Dwight Smith. Assistant coach positions at Mount Ida College and UMass Lowell, preceded his move to Curry as defensive coordinator for two years and offensive

## Chapter Member Schluntz and 2011 Scholar-Athlete Costello Selected for NFF National Honors

The Jack Grinold Eastern Massachusetts Chapter was prominently featured at the 2011 National Football Foundation Chapter Awards Luncheon held December 9, at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City.

Ed Schluntz, a charter member of the Chapter was honored with one of five Chapter Leadership Awards, and 2011 Chapter Scholar-Athlete Matt Costello of Everett High

School was named one of five national Scholar-Athletes.

Schluntz has served on the chapter's board of directors since its inception in 1976. He has coordinated the Chapter's scholar-athlete awards, expanding the Chapter's honorees from 11 to 33 scholar-athletes. Schluntz won the Chapter's Contribution to Amateur Football Award in 1978, and the award was named in his honor since 2008. Schluntz also spearheaded the effort to name the Chapter after its founder, Jack Grinold, in 2007.

Claiming a 4.52 grade-point average on a 4.0 scale, Costello graduated sixth out of 385 students at Everett. He was a member of the National Honor Society, Students Initiating Change, and the Italian Club. He worked as a peer tutor and spent his summers coaching children at the Everett Recreation Center. He was also an ambassador with the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletics Association. A versatile athlete, Costello also excelled in basketball and baseball, earning all-star honors in both sports and playing on multiple league championship teams. He earned a starting spot at wide receiver at Princeton University his freshman season.

Johnson was a Capital One Academic All-District selection in 2011, and is a three-time NE-10 All-Academic. He was a Dean's list student multiple times during his undergraduate years.

Johnson has been active in both the Bentley and Waltham communities in various capacities. He has served on the Bentley Student Athlete Advisory Committee and has assisted on freshman move-in day. He has coached both Pop Warner football and Community Use basketball and volunteered at a road race benefiting Special Olympics. Johnson has also worked with the 2+2=5 Program at the Stanley Elementary School, a program that teaches teamwork skills to children through structured activities.

This spring, the Hopedale, Mass native has competed with the Bentley baseball team for the first time. He has played outfield.

coordinator for a year under former New England Patriot Steve Nelson.

Bandini was named head coach at Curry in 2006 following Nelson's departure. In the five seasons since he took over the reins, the Colonels have compiled a 52-16 record (.765 winning percentage). Curry captured the championship of the New England Football Conference in 2006 and 2007, and Bandini's squads participated in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament in 2006, 2007, and 2008. A 2007 win over Hartwick College was the first ever NCAA tournament win for an NEFC team, and a 26-21 victory at Ithaca College in 2008 marked the NEFC's first-ever road Tournament victory. Following the 2011 season, Bandini and his staff were selected to coach the North squad in the Division III All-Star Classic in Salem, Va.

In 1999, Bandini began MasterSports, an organization originally designed to provide an opportunity for coaches to get together and discuss football. In 2001 Bandini conducted the first MasterSports Football Clinic, and established awards as a memorial to special men who played and/or coached the game. To date, the awards made in honor of these men have resulted in the distribution of nearly \$114,000 to 136 young men to assist them in furthering their education.

"I've known Skip since we worked together at MIT," Grinold Chapter Executive Director **Roger Crosley** says. "As great a coach as he has proven to be, he's an even better human being. The work he and his board of directors have done with MasterSports is truly amazing. He has shown his love for the game of football by giving back in a way that few have. I'm thrilled that the Chapter is honoring his incredible body of work."

He also served as head coach at St. Patrick's High School in Watertown for six years (25-29-1) after a three year stint as an assistant coach at Tufts University, his alma mater.

A 1974 graduate of Everett High School where he played football and baseball, DiBiaso attended Phillips Exeter Academy and also lettered in both sports at the prep school. He is a football letterman from Tufts where he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees.

The Schluntz Award is the latest in a long list of honors for DiBiaso as he has been named the *Boston Globe* Coach of the year four times, the Riddell Atlantic Region Coach of the Year (2003), the New England Patriots High School Coach of the year (twice), and in 2005 was named to the Italian American Sports Hall of Fame.

"Coach DiBiaso is a fixture in Everett and a credit to his city and his school district," Chapter Executive Director **Roger Crosley** said. "He has given back to his community in so many ways as both a coach and an educator. It's rare in these times to see someone spend nearly his entire life in one place, and Everett is richer for that. The Chapter is honored to present him with the Schluntz Award."

In addition to his football and athletic director responsibilities, DiBiaso also coaches basketball at Everett.
