2 Oil City Sisters Die In Wreck

Two Oil City sisters were killed about 6 a.m. Sunday in a one-car accident on U.S. Hwy. 167, about six miles south of Ville Platte.

Nancy W. Allen, 22, and Deborah Allen, 16, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Allen, were pronounced dead at the scene by the St. Landry Parish coroner, who released the bodies to La Fond Funeral Home in Opelousas. The bodies were transferred to Rose-Neath Funeral Home.

According to Troop I State Police, the driver of the car, Nancy, apparently lost control of the vehicle while attempting to negotiate a curve.

Troopers said the auto crashed through a fence after leaving the highway, struck a telephone pole and then rammed into an embankment causing the vehicle to flip over. It came to rest 310 feet from where it left the road, police said.

FUNERAL SERVICES for the Allen sisters will be held at 2:30 p.m. today in the Rose-Neath Funeral Home chapel in Shreveport with the Rev. Leo Van Horran, chaplain of St. Francis Cabrini Hospital in Alexandria, officiating. Burial will be in Chapelwood Cemetery in Vivian.

Nancy Allen was a nursing student at Louisiana State University in Alexandria and was graduated from North Caddo High School. She had attended Northwestern State University for three and a half years. Her sister Deborah was a senior at St. Vincent's Academy in Shreveport.

Both were Shreveport natives and had lived most of their lives in Oil City. They were members of the Catholic church.

SURVIVORS, in addition to their parents, include three brothers, W. C. (Pat) Allen III and Alton E. Allen, both of Shreveport, and Ronnie Royce Allen of Mooringsport, and their maternal grandmother, Mrs. Nancy Smith of Naborton.

Pallbearers will be Royce Allen Jr., Billy Allen Jr., Jerry Allen, Clarence Holsapple, Gary Bass and Darryl Rathbun.
