throughout the year.

Our San Antonio Fear-Free Environment (SAFFE) Officer J. Reno, 207-5196; members from San Antonio Fire Department; and Reuben Duron, Code Enforcement, 213-9489, were present. Councilman Mike Gallagher provided an update on northeast San Antonio developments, including the opening of the Northeast Senior Center on October 30. Please thank Mike Gallagher for replacing STOP signs and NO PARKING signs that have faded from our south Texas sun. It is a lot easier to maintain traffic control when folks can see and read the signs.

November 3rd is the date to vote on a \$500 million bond election for the Northeast Independent School District (NEISD). Upgrades are planned for almost every school. Safety and security - \$20 million, Technology - \$72.365 million, District Operations - \$60 million, Extracurricular - \$89.75 million, District Facilities - \$225.835 million and \$32 million for Management and Contingency. Please check www.neisd.net/bond2015 for more specific details.

San Antonio is beginning its "Pay-As-You-Throw" campaign for garbage. You have the choice of three garbage cans sizes and you get a green (organic waste) container for free. Prices are \$20.43, \$20.93 and \$22.18 per month. Gradually the price difference will increase between the small and large sizes. See www.sanantonio.gov/swmd for more information.

New laws passed this year affect both homeowners associations (HOAs) and residents in Royal Ridge. A brief summary has been added to the RRNA home page at www.royalridgesa.org.

I must also thank attorney resident **Jeff Altman** for providing insurance information to attendees at the September 15 Royal Ridge Recreational Clubhouse (RRRC) evening seminar. We learned about the interplay between insurance, bonding and hiring independent contractors. Jeff also discussed insurance and our HOAs when they contract to repair and paint houses. The information was very useful to everyone who attended.

San Antonio Code Enforcement exists to address many problems facing our neighborhood. Call 311 or file complaints on-line at www.sanantonio.gov/311. We, as homeowners, are responsible for sidewalk maintenance and keeping plants trimmed to allow

passage of pedestrian traffic. If our sidewalks have major cracks or non-level surfaces, we must fix them. Overhead sidewalk clearance must be at least eight (8) feet. Alley clearances must be fourteen (14) feet high and fifteen (15) feet wide to allow vehicle passage. For other requirements, see the San Antonio City Code, Chapter 14-61.

It is in everyone's interest to keep our neighborhood nice and neat looking. Please do your part to continue to make Royal Ridge the jewel of this area.

I encourage everyone to become involved with our HOAs. We need the help. It takes time to learn the needs of our community. If you join with us, we can all work to preserve our neighborhood and our home values. As you can see above, we have a community that cares and is willing to devote some, or a lot, of their time to making Royal Ridge the best place to live in San Antonio.

ROYAL RIDGE CITIZENS ON PATROL

E ach month several neighbors give me a call or send me an email reporting burglaries, thefts, criminal mischief, etc.. Or, they simply inquire about similar activities they have heard about. I appreciate those calls and report them in-turn to our community policing officer, Officer Jason Reno, for his information and follow-up as appropriate.

I routinely review daily Spotcrime.com and RaidsOnline.com reports for the Royal Ridge and

surrounding communities and monthly San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) Neighborhood Calls-for-Service logs for happenings and trends. Our RR COP members are well aware of our relatively low crime experience and I attribute much of that to their daily patrol efforts. Having a patrol out an average of two hours daily in different vehicles at random times is a clear sign we care and is a great deterrent. Thank you RR COP members, past and present!

Similarly, our neighbors typically call the SAPD from one and a half to two times daily for some type of police matter such as reporting a crime, seeing suspicious activity, complaining of disturbances, etc.. That translates to an SAPD patrol responding to Royal Ridge roughly 45-60 times each month, some months a few more, some a few less. Unfortunately but necessarily, the majority of those calls are for cause but roughly a third are for miscellaneous reasons such as exchanging information, public assistance and similar reasons. All-in-all, we enjoy great support from the SAPD and Officer Reno resulting in the relatively crime free environment I mentioned earlier.

We are not as crime-free though as many of us would like but that's not the world we live in. That means of course that we need to continue to remain vigilant and involved. Some folks express surprise to learn we have an average of about eight residence or vehicle related thefts or burglaries in Royal Ridge each month. Many thefts from residences or residence burglaries occur during the daytime with vehicle burglaries and thefts more common overnight. Still, we only report suspicious persons and activities just over four times monthly. Should we do better or is that all we are seeing?

Disturbingly (pun intended) the majority of SAPD calls to our neighborhoods are for disturbances, e.g. loud music, barking dogs, and, most concerning and frequently, angry family members, housemates or neighbors, just under one third of the total calls to the SAPD each month. Here, we just need to be more respectful of one another and work toward improvement. If you have a concern or need intervention, start by contacting Officer Reno, Jason.Reno@sanantonio.gov. He can get you pointed in the right direction for the assistance you may need.

Thanks to all Royal Ridge residents and particularly RR COP members for your interest and support. Remind yourselves of holiday safety and security measures whether at home, out shopping or visiting elsewhere. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

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
