Unit 9 in the 4th edition includes 7 subsections that correlate to chapters 30-31 of the 3rd edition. Period 9 is only 5% of the exam. If you are running out of time, I recommend emphasizing Reagan years then summarize the other main events.

This guide is divided into 7 sections and can be assigned in parts or in its entirety to be completed over the course of the unit. The format is slightly different from the older set. I also indicate the most significant topics (in my personal analysis) with font size and highlighting. The spacing is also cues to the depth of notes required. If students do not have a lot of space to write, then they only need a few notes or key words. Formatting among the 4th edition guides varies, as I am trying to find the most effective strategies. I am sure things will be updated again in the future as tweaks are necessary. You will also notice links to writing activities and enrichment options to help students and teachers navigate more smoothly to additional resources. Many of those resources are also unscrupulously sold by others on TPT and coursehero. Please spread the word that I provide these activities for FREE.
