She has completed one licensing exam and will take another in October, after which she will be dually licensed as a marriage and family therapist and mental health counselor. Her area of

specialty is girls and young women, ages 8 to 24.

Dawn and her husband Jim Johnson live in Story City and have been attending our church for a year. She appreciates that FBC is a diverse congregation where all are welcome, and says that it is good to be back in the ABC.

Tiffany Harris will graduate from Iowa State with a BS in Microbiology, with a minor in Emerging Global Diseases. She will be entering a PhD program in Microbiology this fall at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. While at ISU she has worked at the vet school at the diagnostic lab in bacteriology as well as at a research lab on

campus that works on E.coli.

Tiffany has lived in various places around the world. She graduated from a high school in Houston, and her parents now live in Louisiana (they moved to Louisiana from Malaysia while she was a student here). She has attended First Baptist for four years and has been especially involved in our music program. She served as our choir accompanist for a year, frequently played piano with our instrumental ensemble, and has especially enjoyed singing in the choir. Tiffany will continue working on campus until she moves to Madison later this summer.



Brandon Jones will graduate from Iowa State with a BS in Civil Engineering with an Environmental Emphasis. He was involved in a lot of activities both within his major and across campus and met a lot of friends along the way. He was involved in the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE), Students Helping Our Peers food pantry

(SHOP), and the ISU Navigators (student-led Bible studies).

Brandon has attended First Baptist throughout his years at ISU (he been a mainstay on the back pew in worship). He wrote, "First Baptist Church has been a very welcoming community. I especially enjoyed the outdoor services we've had and the annual Day of Service where we get to help out the Ames community. I'm very grateful for the First Baptist Church being my church family away from home." In June, Brandon will begin work at F.H. Paschen Construction in Chicago as a project engineer.



Tiffany Nugent will receive a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Integrated Studio Arts from Iowa State. She has especially focused on furniture design and animation. Tiffany has been a part of Gamma Rho Lambda, Omicron Chapter at ISU.

Like Brandon and Tiffany, Tiffany has also attended our church for four years. She has

been very involved in our ministry – among other things, she has been a faithful participant in our college class and took part in our mission trip to Kansas City last year. Tiffany is from Wilmington, Illinois, about 60 miles southwest of Chicago. She will be in Ames for another year. She does not know where she will be working yet but her plan is to save money and pay off student loans. She wrote, "What I love about First Baptist is how it feels like a family and how welcoming and loving everyone is."

"Spirited Listening" Coming June 4

Our church is a member of AMOS (A Mid-Iowa Organizing Strategy) - a grassroots, congregationally-based community organizing group. AMOS researches issues that are of concern to the community and works to make changes that make for a more fair, just, and workable community for everybody. The way that AMOS determines which issues to address is through "House Meetings" of 6-8 people in which persons share what concerns and pressures they feel in their lives – what "keeps them awake at night." Out of the stories shared in a multitude of meetings held by many congregations and institutions, themes emerge, and common themes lead to issues for research and action.

These small group conversations can be a great opportunity for our church to not only participate in the work of AMOS, but also support one another as a church family. To make these meetings as accessible to the greatest number of people as possible, we will have our conversations on a Sunday morning following worship. On **Pentecost Sunday, June 4** - when we celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit - we will be involved in "Spirited Listening" as we listen to one another's stories, and listen to the Spirit leading us.

The way it will work: following that morning's worship service, those who are willing to participate will break into small groups in which we will share some of our stories. Each group will have a trained leader to guide the conversation, keep us on track, and help us be mindful of time. Participants will only be asked to share what they are comfortable sharing. The exercise will take around 45 minutes and we will then join together for a meal. Emerging themes from our conversations will help determine the issues for AMOS research teams to address, but just as important will be the value to our congregation as we listen to each other's stories.

Folks can decide to participate that morning, but to help us determine how many groups to plan for (and how many to plan on for lunch,) we are encouraging everyone to sign up in advance. You can do so by sending an email to the church office (office@fbcames.org), or sign up at church.
