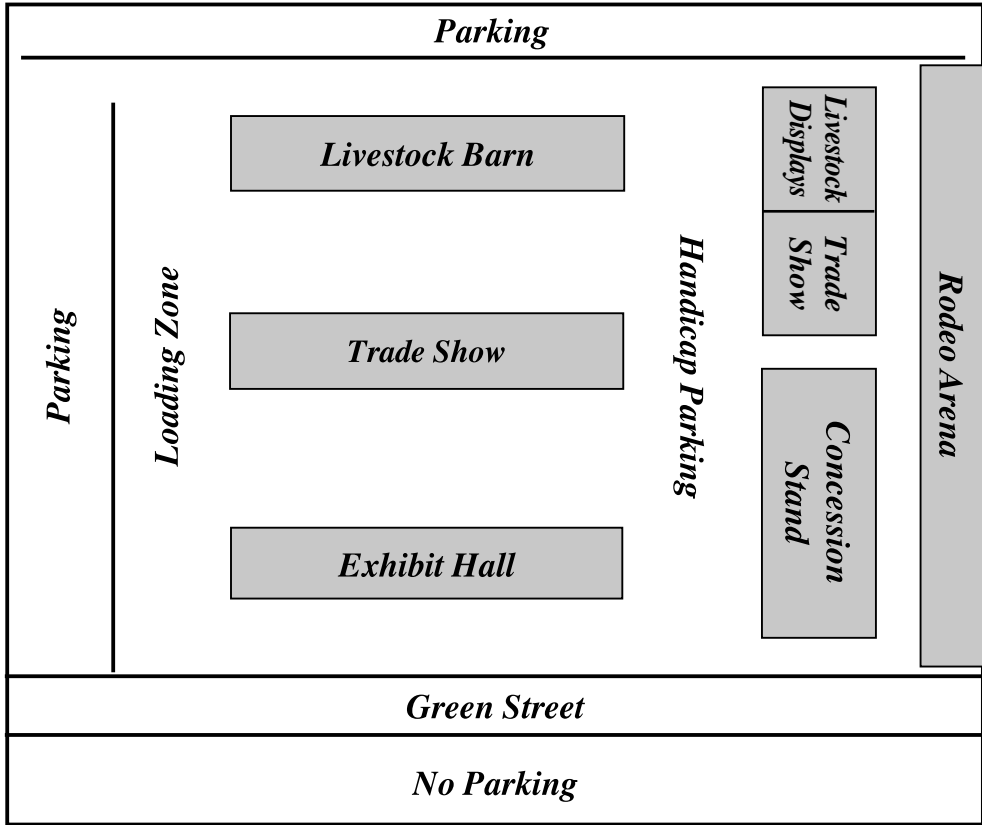

THE WILD COW MILKING involves teams of 4 (which we set up) who run down to the cow and catch her. While one member milks the cow in a little bucket, the "milker" gets on the back of the cow and the other 3 pull her back to the judge. The milk is then dumped into the judge's hand just like a real rodeo.

Another event we do is THE DUMMY ROPING event. We teach kids how to rope and we furnish the miniature feed sack and ropes.

We have pygmy goats to do the THE GOAT TIE. Even the toddlers can get involved. We put the ribbon on the tail and they run down to the goat, take the ribbon off and bring it back to the judge. As the kids get older the events get tougher.

There are races and activities for parents and grandparents too! Get involved with your kids and have a time to remember!

These are only a few of the activities that we offer. Come on out for a good time.

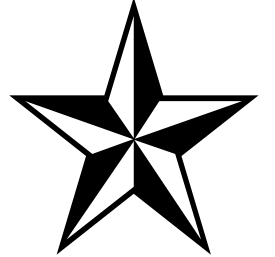

1. All entries must be made by a resident of Cherry County or one of the following surrounding counties: Bennett, Todd, Brown, Keya Paha, Thomas, Hooker, Grant or Sheridan and must be a product of the exhibitor's county.
2. All entries must be completed since the last Cherry County Fair unless otherwise stated in a specific division.
3. Entry Day is Wednesday, August 8 at the Ag Building on the Cherry County Fairgrounds from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Please do not bring Open Class Entries before 5:00 p.m. Horse, livestock, small pets and dog entries will be taken the day of the show. North door is the loading zone.
4. Exhibits will be judged on quality to determine the ribbon placing.
5. The decision of the judges is final.
6. The Cherry County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to an exhibit.
7. Only one entry per class per exhibitor in all divisions unless stated otherwise in a specific division.
8. Exhibits will be released from 4:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 12. If you cannot pick up your exhibits at this time please contact the Superintendent to make other arrangements.
9. The white tags that are attached to each individual exhibit will be available August 1 at Country Fabric & Crafts. Exhibitors are encouraged to pick up the tags and complete them ahead of check-in. Tags will also be available at check-in.
10. Exhibits not picked up on Sunday between 4:30 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. WILL NOT RECEIVE THEIR PREMIUM CHECK. Please check-out at the desk.

If an exhibit does not meet the judges' minimum criteria, the exhibit will be awarded a green participation ribbon and no premium.

Tear off the bottom after writing a brief identification note and AFTER you submit your entry. Use bottom portion to claim your exhibit on Sunday. Please check out at table to receive your premium check, if you don't, you will not receive your premium check!

Guidelines:

- Labeling** - Labeling should include: name of product, processing method and style of pack.
- Uniformity** - Half pint jars may be used for jellies and preserves. The jars are not to be decorated by the exhibitor in any way. Exhibits must be in standard canning jars and sealed with two piece lids. Please show with rings on.
- Current project** - All canning must have been completed since the last Cherry County Fair.
- Only one exhibit per class for each exhibitor**, except for soft spread classes where two exhibits per exhibitor are allowed.
- Processing Methods** - Current USDA processing method must be followed for all food preservation. Jams, preserves, marmalades, fruit, tomatoes, and pickled vegetables must be processed in a boiling water bath. (Tomatoes may also be processed in a pressure canner.) All non-acid vegetables and meats must be processed in pressure canner. Spoilage disqualifies entry.
- Jars and rings must be clean and show no signs of rust.**
