Corner Kick procedure

- 1) Take a position so you can see everything involved
- 2) Make sure keeper not being impeded
- 3) Make sure keeper not impeding strikers
- 4) Make sure players are holding
- 5) Tactical blocking in and around the area
- 6) Restart when ready.

Caution procedure -

- 1) Recognise the offence and stop play
- 2) Control ball
- 3) Quick or managed restart depending on position on FoP. Nearer the area, manage.
- 4) Manage the wall
- 5) Your position, your escape (think about where the ball may go)
- 6) Restart when ready

Technical area procedure -

- 1) Awareness of problem
- 2) Approach to area, is it required, approach in calm manner
- 3) Attempt to calm
- 4) Engage in dialogue, not too much
- 5) Have the last word/give explanation
- 6) Remove the guilty party if needed



Throw in procedure -

- 1) What does law require?
- 2) Knowing at duties of Ref and AR
- 3) Position of throw – consistency
- 4) Position and actions of opponents, where are they stood?
- 5) Actions of feet and arms
- 6) Restart when ready

Advantage procedure -

- 1) Seriousness of offence, can you play advantage?
- 2) Opportunity to control ball unchallenged
- 3) Position on FOP
- 4) Signal - two or one arm outstretched
- 5) How long to hold signal
- 6) Any follow up action, possible caution or talking too

Penalty kick procedure

- 1) Recognise offence and award
- 2) Discipline
- 3) Manage players
- 4) Encroachment by players and keeper
- 5) Consistency of application of law
- 6) Restart when ready
