Twin Cities Model A Ford Meeting Minutes for February 13th, 2024

Meeting called to order at 7:06 P M. via Zoom internet platform.

Attendance: Board Members present: President -Jerome Bokelmann, Vice President - Marc Rude, Treasurer - Doug Portlance, Junior Board, Blain Maus, Secretary - Mark Leder. Members present: Jerry Schilling, Dale Pomerleau, Steve Barnacle, Steve Johnson, Peter Trence and Roberta Butek. Jerome Bokelmann called the meeting to order and conducted the board meeting in accordance with his duties to meet with the board in the monthly scheduled meeting.

Secretary's report: The President asked if there were any corrections or additions to the report for the January printed copy of the minutes. A motion was made by Doug Portlance to accept the January minutes as printed in the Ahoogah Newsletter in January. The motion was seconded by Marc Rude and the motion was passed unanimously.

Treasures report:

Doug Portlance presented the treasures report. A paper copy will be retained with the official club notes. The report as will be placed in the official club notes. A motion was made by Marc Rude to accept the report as presented, a second was made by Mark Leder and the vote was unanimous and passed.

Budget A discussion was started on the current amounts budgeted for the 2023 budget and what to change if needed for 2024. The discussion focused on the fact that our 2023 budget met the needs of the forecasted expenses. The topic of expense for technology was discussed in relation to our current equipment and possible upgrades or additions to our audio, visual or data storage needs. A good discussion on how we want to use technology to gain new and retain existing members. The consensus was to increase the technology budget line from \$250.00 to \$750.00. in the proposed budget. The second item discussed was allotting \$50.00 to the Library and Video needs. Board members would only consider spending money should the need arise, not just spend because we have funds allocated. The board is determined to be fiscally responsible. A motion was made by Doug Portlance to accept these changes to the budget and modify the 2023 budget to reflect the technology increase and Library, Video amount thus creating our 2024 budget. Marc Rude seconded the motion, a vote was taken, and the motion was passed.

Membership report: We have three new members presented for nomination. Chad and Julie Huntington of Brooklyn Center MN. with a 1928 Phaeton, Jim Huntington of Saint Joseph MN. with a 1928 Phaeton and Gary Pomerleau of Shoreview MN.with a 1930 Fordor. A motion was made to accept these three applicants for membership by Doug Portlance, Mark Leder seconded the motion, a vote was taken, and it was unanimous for approval.

It was reported that at this time from our membership director that she estimates we have somewhere around 30 members from last year not renewing. A short discussion regarding why we may have non renewals, some are members that have passed, others mentioned health reasons of certain members mentioned. As always some lose interest or relocate. We have not received anyone not renewing due to a voiced complaint of our club. Our membership is now roughly 240 member families.

Membership Greeter: Our official greater was not present and will contact these newly approved members. We have a report from him that he did contact the last months new members.

Clinics: Our Clinics this month will have Phil Zins give us a presentation of cross shaft rebuilding and updated methods from earlier presentations to our group on this subject. Next month we are looking forward to a clinic on Motometers. Our presentations can be brief subjects, or in depth, please contact anyone on the board or our clinic coordinators with your content.

Coffee Social- Brad Nelson has scheduled a gathering at his shop to view the work on the fine point restoration nearly finished on Vince Smith's car February 24th.


New Business: None

February Clinic

Our topic this night was the rebuilding of the brake cross shaft. Phil Zins has been working on these shafts and previously shared his skills and methods of restoring these. Tonight, he updated us in great details of the new tools, fixtures and solutions he has developed to get these back into factory new condition. We had an impressive display of the assemblies in the room in various states of tear down and typical as found problems that one would see on this shaft removed from service. Overly worn shafts, worn out bearings, clevis eyes oversized from wear, bent clevis connectors, and bent shafts to name a few.

The rebuild process of removing stuck arms, the weld up and machining back to spec of the shafts, hot riveting along with precision measuring was explained in great detail with the visual presentation this night. Phil answered many questions and the actual sample parts he brought were a great help to understand just what needs to be done. There is a way to replace your worn bearings by bringing the worn journals back to spec by welding and machining, there is another way to short cut this step by a "new" kit offered by venders, as well as choices in the material and design of the bearings. Phil explained just what is available and the choices that one could make. Phils has a detailed hand out of the presentation that he will e mail to you if are interested and the club has uploaded this presentation to our new Youtube channel – TCMAFC. If you clink on this in Youtube you will see this excellent presentation along with other presentations and videos that we are loading up now as we build our Youtube site.

Fine Point Car Coffee Social Gathering


Can anyone envision Vince Smith as a thirteen-year-old boy in the small town of Browns Valley Minnesota? What is also hard to imagine is that same thirteen-year-old boy in the early 1960's having made his mind up on owning a Model A Ford. Small town boy, with a family that worked very hard, Vince worked odd jobs in that small community, but his paper route earnings of \$300.00 finally needed to be spent for his dream. He let it be known that he was looking for a Model A, a college kid in his town knew what Vince was looking for and told him of a school friend that was selling a his 1930 Town Sedan. Vince got his father to drive him and his little brother to Holdingford Minnesota about a 130 mile drive thru farm county to look at the car he was told was for sale. Vince relates they stopped on a road overlooking the property, he saw the car from a distance, and it was a thirteen - year-olds' love at first sight.

Vince's father made the deal for his son, and they got into the car with mismatched wheels and questionable mechanicals and started the drive home on a warm sunny day with Vince in the front and his little brother in the back who discovered that the window shades pulled down in the rear compartment much to the dislike of Smith senior. They couldn't roll them up, it was dark and the ability to see out was poor, so they removed them on one of the numerous stops along the way for oil and other quick fixes. The one big surprise along the way was the brakes really didn't work and Vince's dad used the emergency brake to control the car.

With the car home under its own power and without any big problems, the young Vince Smith began to make himself familiar with his dream car. A thirteen- year -old boy has a lot of growing up to do, there was school, work, military service, work, more school, becoming a school teacher, marriage, children, and finally the car in his more mature life came back to this dreamer. Now for almost the last 20 years of his research, collecting parts, and then even collecting better parts the car is coming to completion. The goal is entry into fine point judging and having everything as original and matching as it came out of the factory. Vince has been working with club member Brad Nelson who also has gone thru fine point judging and built his own extremely high scoring 1929 Town Sedan. Vince has high praise for the members of the TCMAFC club and the support he has received in his quest to finish this car and all he has learned as a member.

Vince and Brad invited TCMAFC to a Coffee Social at Brads shop for us to see the results of all of the work. We had a large turnout, new members were in attendance and some of our mature members who we don't get to see as much were in attendance. Vince proudly showed off his car and pointed out the details important for fine judging, such as month specific parts for this certain car. Brad painted this car which is impeccable and his knowledge of judging standards and how certain finishes are present on fasteners, engine parts and the chassis were on display. Pin striping is scheduled in the next few weeks and Vince is not that far away from realizing that these many years of work to see this project of a "factory fresh car" started from the age of thirteen become reality.








Photo Contest For 2024




