## Instructions

The following illustration shows the Ground Plan and Elevation drawings and there two-sided pages of the and how to use them. If you print out both pages and place them back to back and hold the Elevation drawing up to a light source and look through it you will see the "Perspective Drawing Grid" printed on the next page. The ground plan illustration below this shows the grid overlay. You can us this grid as a guide when you work on transferring your floor plan to your front elevation, as discussed in this chapter.

Another method is to place a piece of tracing paper over the perspective drawing grid and work on it, to allow for corrections and also to save the grid for future use.
