

Dr. Eldwin R. Wittwer,

Funeral services were held Friday in Detroit for Dr. Eldwin Ray Wittwer, 58, well-known radiologist of Harper and other Detroit hospitals, who died at his Grosse Pointe home Tuesday evening.

Doctor Wittwer was a native of Ontario, and received his education in Michigan public schools, graduating from Pigeon High school in 1902. He attended Valparaiso University and the Detroit College of Medicine and Surgery. Doctor Wittwer has contributed many technical publications to medical literature, and has held many offices in local, state and national medical organizations.

In 1945 he was elected president of the Radiological Society of North America, and he has been prominent in the American Council of Radiology, of which he was a fellow, the American Roentgen Ray Society and the American Medical association, as well

as being councilor for the Michigan State Medical society. He was a past president of the Detroit Roentgen Ray and Radium society, and was secretary and treasurer of that society for 22 years.

In addition to his strenuous professional activities, Doctor Wittwer was a member of University Lodge No. 482, F. and A. M., of the Detroit Consistory, of Highland Park chapter R.A.M., Highland Park Commandery No. 53, Knights Templar, and a past president of the Masonic Templar association.

He was intensely interested in farming and in the production of milk and for many years was a member of the Wayne County Milk commission.

He is survived by his wife, Maud, a daughter, Mary Helen, one brother, Wesley, of Detroit, and three sisters, Susan C. and Sarah Wiewer, both of Detroit, and Mrs. Barbara Searle, of Los Angeles, Calif.
