# 2nd Annual BTNA Neighborhood Garage Sale

Barber Tract Neighborhood Association will be hosting the second annual garage sale on Saturday, April 29th 2017. Last year 15 homes participated with a goal to double that number for 2017. Popular garage sale



items include furniture, kids & baby clothes and toys, bikes, power tools and accessories, clothing, dishes and glassware, and entertainment items such as books, movies, video games and electronics.

Now is the time to start thinking about what items have been taken up space without use and put it up for sale at the upcoming neighborhood garage sale. If you only have a few items you may want to team up with a neighbor to attract more buyers who are

hunting for bargains. Here are a few tips on having a great garage sale:

- Layout: Arrange items by category and make it easy to navigate between sections. Hang clothes, set up tables to showcase sale items. Presentation matters.
- Pricing: Make sure all your items are clearly marked with price tags, which will discourage bargain-hunters from offering a bargain-basement price on items that aren't marked. Mark items with round numbers such as \$2 instead of \$1.90.
- Create ambiance: Music in the background sets the mood so buyers are not shopping in silence....

- Team up with neighbors: Not only does this arrangement mean you have more stuff to sell and more variety in sizes and types of things offered, it also means you have more help. You can divvy up the responsibilities and attract more buyers with wider breadth of items.
- Cash-on-hand: Remember to have small denominations available to provide change.
- Make extra money: Buyers are hungry and thirsty as well feel free to have lemonade, bottle water and/or cookies for sale as well.
- Advertise- BTNA will put notifications in Craig's List, La Jolla Light, <u>nextdoor.com</u> as well as provide key signage around the neighborhood.
- Start collecting your clutter now in order to be ready for the big day.

# Save the Date for Beach Cleanup at Barber Tract

Join us on Earth Day 2017, Saturday, April 22nd, as we beautify over 100 sites in San Diego County! Last year, a record breaking 6,400 volunteers came out to our 110 sites and successfully removed 150,000 lbs. of litter. Instead of turning a blind eye to the abundance of litter found across San Diego County, our volunteers channeled their appreciation for San Diego's environment into action to protect it.

Registration will open on April 1st! Creek to Bay is one of hundreds of cleanups hosted by ILACSD. In 2015, ILACSD mobilized over 32,000 volunteers who removed half a million pounds of debris from San Diego County.
