The riders will ride to the Thundering Hooves Memorial Fence in Toyahvale, Texas with a closing ceremony in memory of all animals that continue to suffer in the name of greed and progress.

**ABOUT THUNDERING HOOVES:** My vision of thundering hooves drove me to take action even though I knew full well the odds of bringing about change were not in my favor. Stopping every truck hauling trailers full of horses to the slaughter export pens is my desire though I am helpless to stop them. Unfortunately, the law is on their side! After realizing there was no saving those destined for slaughter I decided to take action by doing what I could do .... thus, the birth of Thundering Hooves.

Today as I stand along this trail, trailers full of slaughter bound horses still pass by.....their nightmare continues.

Every time a load of horses, being hauled to the slaughter export pens passes by my home, I am reminded the Thundering Hooves movement is about them and their struggles....and we are their voice! As difficult as this journey has been I give thanks to the Creator for giving me the strength to continue. I have met many amazing Horse Warriors who, without their support, my vision of thundering hooves would have never come to life.

The Chinati Foundation, founded by artist Donald Judd, displays huge indoor and outdoor installations on an old army base. 

CAPTURING WILD HORSES is a documentary about the wild horses living near Challis, Idaho.

Idaho's wild horse country, near the Lower East Fork of the Salmon River. I interviewed several wild horse advocates leading up to the controversial roundup that took place last fall. Then I spent about a week filming the roundup and interviewing the BLM officers who were in charge of the operation. It was very informative, but also tough to watch.





Carrie and Mary Dann are feisty Western Shoshone sisters who have endured five terrifying livestock roundups by armed federal marshals in which more than a thousand of their horses and cattle were confiscated -- for grazing their livestock on the open range outside their private ranch.

That range is part of 60 million acres recognized as Western Shoshone land by the United States in the 1863 Treaty of Ruby Valley, but in 1974 the U.S. sued the Dann sisters for trespassing on that land, without a permit. That set off a dispute between the Dann sisters and the U.S. government that swept to the United States Supreme Court and eventually to the Organization of American States and the United Nations.





In 2013, meatballs served in the restaurants at IKEA stores in Europe were found to contain an unadvertised ingredient - horsemeat. But the problem wasn't just IKEA's.

Within a short period of time, it was discovered there were other global companies selling

beef products containing up to 40% horsemeat. The names were very familiar; Tesco, Birds Eye, and the international fast food chains, Taco Bell and Burger King. Europe's "Horsegate" as it became known, shocked an unsuspecting public around the world, but didn't shock those in horse-related industries. Kill Pen is an exploration of the criminal activity behind the underground horse slaughter industry in America. With candid interviews, whistleblower footage and underground video, Kill Pen investigates how and why unregulated horsemeat is getting into the human food chain. The film examines the risks of consumption in such a system, as many of these horses are diseased and heavily drugged with dangerous, disease-causing substances. Clearly, this is a system which should not flourish in the United States, but powerful political and economic forces encourage its existence.

Twenty-two US veterans commit suicide every day. At over 8,000 a year, this is four times greater than the casualties assumed in the War in Afghanistan. And that doesn't account for the 1 in 5 veterans diagnosed with PTSD, depression or other psychological disabilities. These men and women are suffering, and in some cases, killing themselves on the very soil they offered their life to protect. Why? If you ask ex-Navy SEAL Micah Fink, he will tell

you it's because the current "treatment" these men and women are receiving isn't working. He's says veterans don't have a disease.

That's why Fink started Heroes and Horses. A program that pushes vets to reintegrate into society in a way that is fundamentally different from current treatments. No therapists, no medication, and no telling them how they should feel or what normal looks like. Instead of numbing the challenges they face, Fink takes them deep into the wilderness- the heart the country they fought for - where they confront those challenges head on.
