

TOWN OF ELBRIDGE
TOWN BOARD MEETING
APRIL 25th, 2019

The Town Board of the Town of Elbridge met on Thursday, April 25th, 2019 at 7PM at the Town Municipal Building, 5 Rte. 31, Jordan, NY, to conduct their regular meeting.

Supervisor Richardson called the meeting to order at 7:03 and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: Councilor Rita Dygert, Councilor Doug Blumer, Councilor Floyd Duger, and Supervisor Vern Richardson.

ABSENT: Councilor Mike Caron

OTHERS PRESENT: Town Attorney Scott Chatfield, and Clerk Deb Stapleton.

ADOPT MINUTES: On a motion of Councilor Duger seconded by Councilor Blumer the minutes from April 11th, 2019 were approved.

MOTION TO PAY BILLS: General Bills Abstract #4, Vouchers #171-196, in the amount of \$61,262.64 were ordered paid, and Highway Bills, Abstract #4, Vouchers #1053-1066, in the amount of \$11,268.48 were ordered paid with a total disbursement of \$72,531.12.

COMMUNICATIONS:

- 1) An Inter-municipal Breakfast is scheduled for May 4th at 9am, hosted by the JECSD.
- 2) The Elbridge FD Installation Banquet is May 4th at The Sunset in Auburn.

OLD BUSINESS: Councilor Dygert discussed further plans for the pavilion project at the JE Community Center and the vegetative buffer required by DEC and the town must follow state wetlands guidelines. Dygert had a layout for ornamental plantings and Duger suggested the Environmental Commission might want to be involved.

NEW BUSINESS: A discussion on cyber security.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilor Dygert: has a meeting scheduled for May 7th with a sales rep from Shepard Sales for the new bus for the JET Program. There are add-ons to be considered and the drivers will be consulted.

Councilor Blumer: Paige has been busy in the Codes office cleaning up and separating Village files. Howard will help villages with the state report. Blumer discussed the adoption on the town's municipal code with additions and to get to final approval.


Councilor Duger: discussion on cleaning scheduled for June 15th and 16th. Seymour Lofft Park looks good for Little League. Native Garden, at the community center, will be moved this month and plans for a patio area there will be addressed. Attended NYS Traffic Incident training at EFD for 1st Responders by DOT and the State Police. Burn ban across the state on until May 14th. Trash Program at the town hall begins May 1st. Work continues on the Shants Road bridge. Employee Handbook meeting on May 2nd.

Councilor Caron: Absent

Supervisor Richardson: the Veteran Banner project is up to 30 banners to honor loved ones in the town. Construction begins Monday, April 29th on State Route 5, between Chamberlin and Sunview Drive to widen and include a turning lane. Much controversy regarding replacing Rte. 81(through the city) and Richardson said the final decision is still a long way off. LED lighting throughout the town was discussed and amount of savings. There are 93 lights and 5 lighting districts. The solar project at the town, and other sites, was discussed also.

On a motion of Councilor Dygert, seconded by Councilor Blumer the meeting was adjourned at 8:25PM.
