Learning How to Pray

Learning how to Pray. Is this a question only for new Christians, or for all of us? I believe it's the latter, "All of Us". Although we may have actively been praying for many years, its kinda like reading the same scripture over and over again, then all of a sudden, one day, it reaches out and shows us a completely different message than we had ever seen, or felt. Prayer can be the same. In short, is there a right way, or wrong way to pray? No and yes. What I mean is, what are we praying for? A new car. A new phone. A new friend-boy or girl. Our will, or God's will.

Although we should pray about everything in our lives, Philippians 4:6 says "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God..." So how does one go about prayer? Who are we praying to? What are we praying for? As for me, I know I'm a sinner. I don't strive to be one, but I am. I'm human. There's only been one human that was without sin. His name is Jesus. The rest of us are

sinners. So how do we pray as sinners? Prayer should be a conversation between us and the one who created us- God. So wouldn't we want to address him as such? Our creator- maker of heaven and earth- Father of all. Then as sinners we probably should ask for our sins to be forgiven. What about thanks, thanks for the grace and mercy God has shown towards us. Then maybe we can ask for our needs as well as others.

Someone came up with A.C.T.S. This explains it a lot more formally than my words.

A.C.T.S. is an acronym for

Adoration

Confession

Thanksgiving

Supplication

Not only does this show us the elements of prayer, it shows the priority. "We" should not be the first thing, but the last thing in our prayers:

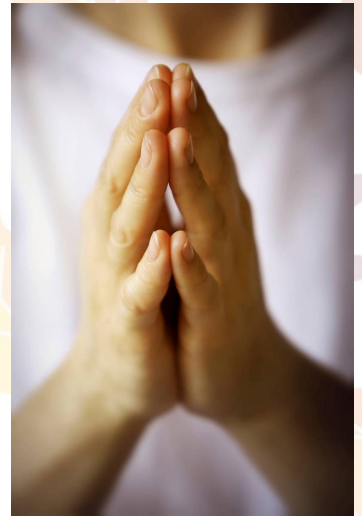
- Adoration: Is respect, reverence, strong admiration or devotion.
- Confession: A **confession** is a statement – made by a person – acknowledging some personal fact that the

person would ostensibly prefer to keep hidden, and is frequently associated with an admission of a moral wrong-sin

- Thanksgiving: Acknowledging what is right about God in praise and thanksgiving (*1 Chr. 16:34*). It can also mean a right acknowledgment of self before God in confessing sin (*Lev. 26:40*)
- Supplication: Is the asking part of prayer. It's the time we spend trusting the Lord to provide something for us or someone we love.

Can you look at Prayer a little differently

now?? What about using this acronym in studying The Lords Prayer. Let me know what you think, or better yet, thank God for who he is. Ask for forgiveness of our sins and thanks for all he does for us. And by the way, I'd really like a new car or direction in my life. Cooksey

How do I know God's will for my Life?

I have often wrestled with this question. I have come to learn that it is not something that happens early in life, it is a lifelong pursuit. There are eight points I'd like to share with you to help you in your own search to know if you are following God's will for your life.

Walk with God.

To know God's will you must learn to walk with God. You need to develop a personal relationship with Him. You should seek to know Him and not just know about Him. The way to cultivate this relationship is spending time in His word, taking time for prayer, and getting involved in your church. Joining a small group or study group are excellent opportunities to know God. When you seek a relationship with God, He is pleased and will be the first to reveal His will for your life.

Surrender your will to God.

Many times what we are searching for is an answer from God that what we want to do, is His will. What we want is a rubber stamp to say, "Yes what you are doing is ok."

Before God will reveal His plan for your life you must be committed to doing what He desires for you. Jesus was willing to die for us; shouldn't we be willing to live for Him?

Obey what you already know to be God's will.

Ninety-eight

this will certainly help you to seek God's will. If you surround yourself with ungodly people His will for your life will be greatly diminished!

Pay attention to How God wired you.

God has given you unique gifts that only you

down a few questions for God. "What is the next step in my career?" or "What is the next step for my family?" During this designated time meditate on these questions. Often God will flood your heart with immediate answers.

Listen to your Heart.

Psalms 37:4-5 tells us, Delight yourself also in the Lord, and He shall give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord, trust also in Him and He shall bring it to pass. We can have the most fun doing what He created us to do!

Take a look at your circumstances.

God has a way of opening doors for us. Every open door is not always His will. God often closes doors to show us what is NOT His will. It's often later we discover His blessings.

I would encourage you to meditate over these eight points and you will discover God's will in your life. When you earnestly seek God's will, you will find it!

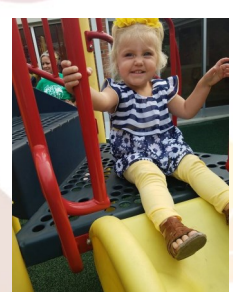
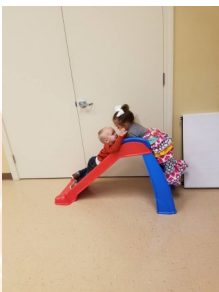
The month of September was SUPER as our preschoolers learned that they can be SUPER with God's help. Here is a look at some of the activities they did last month:

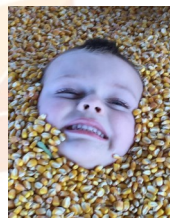

Thank you to everyone who came out to Cate's Farm for our Church-Wide Family event on September 24th! And thank you to the Fellowship Team for providing the food!

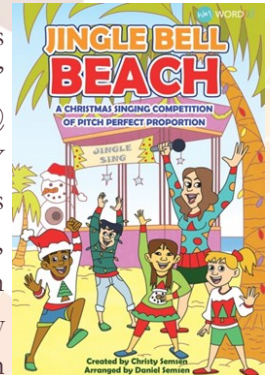


CHILDREN'S HAND BELL CHOIR

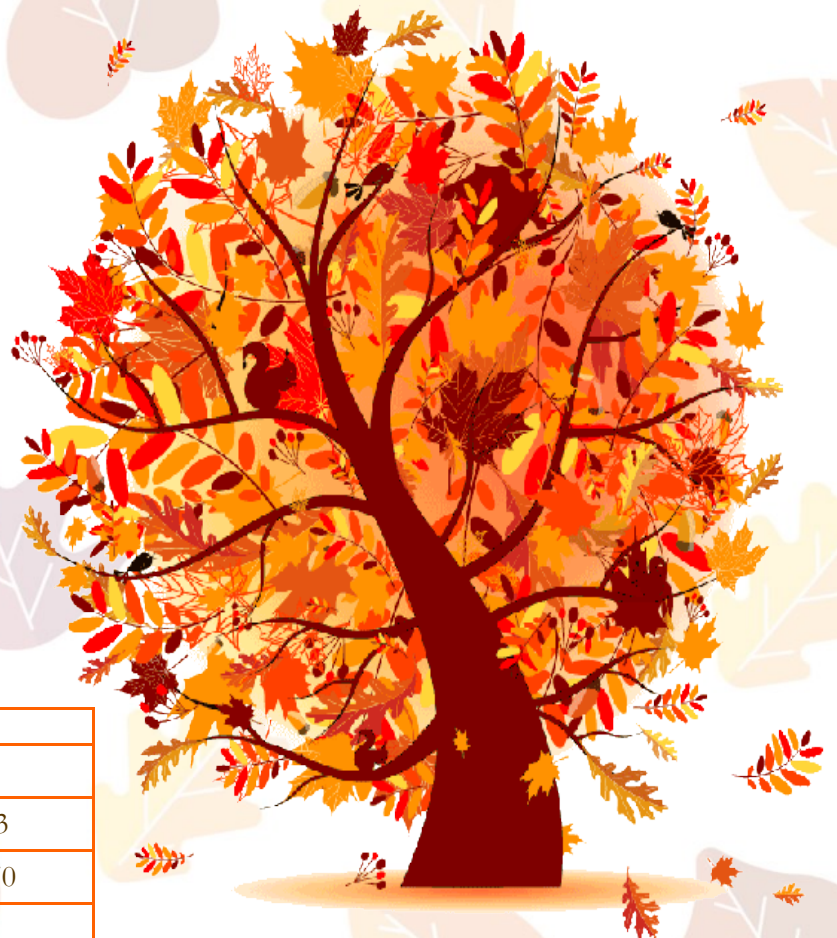
