MAKE A DIFFERENCE!!! BECOME A VETERAN MENTOR FOR THE COUNTY OF HENRICO VETERANS' TREATMENT DOCKET



WHAT IS THE VETERAN'S TREATMENT DOCKET AND THE ROLE OF THE MENTOR?

Henrico County is in the process of implementing a specialty docket that focuses on "justice involved veterans" who struggle with substance abuse and/or mental health issues. Twenty years of war have left lasting scars on some of our veterans, and self-medicating with drugs and/or alcohol has led to problems. The docket diverts these veterans from the criminal justice system into an intensive treatment program, giving them a chance to finally address the underlying issues that led to their criminal behavior.

For this docket to succeed, it is essential to have veteran mentors assigned to each veteran defendant mentee. The Mentor is a volunteer who acts as a coach, guide, role model and advocate for the Mentee and provides moral support during the treatment program. Mentors are assigned to mentees based on branch of service, gender, age, interests, etc. All mentors must be veterans who have an honorable discharge and must have time on a weekly basis to devote to their mentee. Mentors are expected to attend all court dates (typically every other week for a couple hours) with their mentees as well as maintain communication outside of court to offer support and guidance throughout the process. Mentors are not treatment providers, but rather help rekindle the pride and camaraderie the veteran had while in uniform.



HOUSTON-HOLICKY-SITTER VETERANS FORUM

HHS Veterans' Forum meets next on Tuesday August 13, 2024.

Location will be Publix, 2250 John Rolfe Pky, Henrico, VA 23233. We will be in the Community Meeting Room on the 2nd floor.

The guest speaker will be **CDR Paul Giarra**, **U.S. Navy (Ret)**. His topic will be USMC operating in the maritime approaches to China, and integration of Marine Corps with USN, USA, USAF, USCG and functional commands (TRANSCOM, SPACECOM, CYBERCOM and STRATCOM). His bio is on the following page.

Doors open at 1115, the program begins at 1150, and the program will conclude by 1300. Lunch may be purchased from the Publix' Deli.

The Houston-Holicky-Sitter Veterans' Forum is an informal forum for veterans of all branches of the armed forces. Col. Joseph J. Holicky, Jr. (USMC, ret.) and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Col. Carl L. Sitter (USMC, ret.) began having lunch together in the mid 1970's following their retirements. Over the years other veterans and local active duty Marines joined them for lunch. In the early 1980's Lt. Col. L.W. "Chip" Houston (USMCR, ret.) became part of the leadership team and served as its Master of Ceremonies for over 25 years. Today nearly 100 veterans meet each month to carry on the HHS tradition and to hear prominent guest speakers address military history, national security issues, and other topics of interest to veterans.

HHS is apolitical, and promotion of political interests is prohibited. HHS is a not-for-profit group, but it is neither a 501c3 nor a 501c4 organization.

At this point in his life, Paul Giarra is dedicated to those who are coming next. Certain of the necessity of broadening the debate over and support for American sea power and maritime strategy, he is one of the coordinators of the Navy Strategy Discussion Group, an informal and off-the-record pro bono civilmilitary organization with its origins extending back to classified Navy staff discussions in the 1980s.

Paul Giarra also is a coordinator of the multi-year American Sea Power Project in the pages of *Proceedings* at the U.S. Naval Institute, chartering current thinking about the ends, ways, and means of American sea power.

He also is one of the founders of the Madison Grand Strategy Project, which convenes monthly sea power workshops.


Paul Giarra uses applied history as a key strategic planning tool. He has been reading naval and military history for more than 60 years, and reading critically for more than 40 years. Commissioned in Harvard's last NROTC class, he never doubted that he was going to be a naval officer, and indulged his enduring interests in ships and aircraft, education, and strategic planning. What surprised him was how broad his Navy and post-Navy career would be.

As a navalist and naval strategist, Mr. Giarra is a frequent collaborator and contributor in the U.S. navalist dialogue on maritime strategy, and writes frequently on the subject of U.S. sea power and maritime strategy.

Before it was publicly acknowledged, he conducted the first unclassified analysis of China's land-mobile, MaRV'd antiship ballistic missile capability, and its serious implications

for American naval strategy and operations. He also is the author of numerous articles in *Proceedings* and elsewhere, including "Ten Realities for the New CNO"; "The Navy and Nation Need a Maritime Strategy"; "A Coherent Maritime Strategy"; and "Time To Recalibrate: The Navy Needs Tactical Nuclear Weapons . . . Again", in response to recent Chinese and Russian nuclear developments.

During his Navy career, Mr. Giarra was a P-3 pilot; a naval strategic planner; and a political-military strategic planner for Far East, South Asia and Pacific issues. He served in two aircraft carriers, USS Guam and USS Midway. As a serving officer, he managed the U.S.-Japan alliance in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. He attended both the U.S. Naval War College, and the Japanese National Institute for Defense Studies (Japan's National War College equivalent).




Marine Corps Reading
