A few months ago, on one of my many drives up Weidner from Walzem Road on a trip from Wal-Mart, or Walgreens, or H-E-B (and to be honest, I may have been to all three), I noticed a pleasant surprise: A pothole I invariably managed to run into jarringly on the drive back to Royal Ridge was now paved over.

Had someone called the 3-1-1 city services hotline to report the increasingly dangerous



pothole? If they did, then the repair should have been made within two business days of the call, according t o City of San Antonio policy. By the city's definition, a pothole is a collapsed area within the roadway

that does not exceed three feet by three feet. Or was this patchwork part of much-needed, planned repairs in our neighborhoods?

Whatever the case, I and my shock absorbers appreciated it. How our city dollars are spent to improve our neighborhoods is a primary concern for all of us, with public safety and city streets and drainage normally topping the list.

A member of **City Councilman Clayton Perry's** office, **Steven Peterson**, recently provided a list of street improvements for District 10 planned for 2018-2022. The estimated cost of these 500 street improvement projects totals a little more than \$33.31 million. Repairs generally fall into the broad categories of fixing cracked seals to asphalt overlay (essentially, repairing potholes).

Some familiar street names in our community are on the list, including Royal Coach, Meadow Haven, Royal Wood, Royal Meadow, Grand Court and Grand Meadow. Many more streets in our neighborhood, however, are not.

The list of street improvement projects for all of

District 10 has been uploaded to our website, www.RoyalRidgeSA.org. Click on the "streets" tab to see if your street is on the list and, if, so, when street repairs will be made to your neck of the woods.

School crosswalk markings in and around Royal Ridge Elementary School also are slated for an estimated \$2,500 upgrade by 2020.

Funding for additional street repairs will require passage of a bond issue, according to the councilman's office. To prepare for a possible future bond package, however, city officials need to know where repairs need to be made. If there are repairs you think need to be made to your street, contact Councilman Perry's office using email address District10@sanantonio.gov or by mail at his office: Councilman Clayton Perry, 635 NE Loop 410, Ste. 604, San Antonio, TX 78209.

Report any and all suspicious persons, vehicles and activities to the SAPD on their non-emergency number, 210-207-SAPD (210-207-7273) at the time you observe it. Certainly report all crimes regardless of whether or not you think the SAPD can do anything about it or might be concerned with more important matters. Knowing the extent and nature of all crimes allows us to be more aware and more vigilant. It allows the SAPD to allocate the proper resources to problem areas. 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
