Winter is upon us. Snow is falling and temperatures are dropping. I think of crawling under a warm afghan reading a good book. Hard to think about summer! Screenings

The Day School feels screenings are very important to the overall health of a child. Talk with your child's pediatrician to determine which screenings are most important for them. The Lucas County Health Department (www.lucascountyhealth.com) can do many of them.

As children grow and are able to discriminate, their vision and hearing should be evaluated by age 4. This insures optimal learning as they begin letters, sounds, shapes, colors, etc. We are fortunate to have Dr. Michael Crawford O.D. coming to complete a vision screening for our pre-kindergarteners on Feb. 20. A note will be sent home with the results. We are looking for a few parents to assist with the screenings. If you can help please call the school office.

Upon your child's arrival at the school, the teachers take note of any unusual symptoms or behaviors that are not normal for that child. As always, please keep your child home if they have had a fever within 24 hours before attending the school program. This is the time of the year when germs multiply and spread fast!

Snow Days and School Closings

First St. John Day School does not delay any of our programs. If the weather is snowy or icy and classes are closed, the notice will be posted on channel 13abc and an email will be sent out to everyone from the school office. When classes are closed, it means that preschool children who attend between 9-12 and the Begindergarten class are closed. The Extended Care classes (Miss Bonnie and Miss Jennifer and Begindergarteners who regularly attend before and after school) will remain open for child care. Extended Care will only close when LUCAS COUNTY issues a Level 3 travel alert. Older siblings under age 12 may also attend Extended Care on school "snow days" if you complete the Child Enrollment and Health Information Form for them. Their cost will be \$25 for the day.

Reminders of Safety

Winter has arrived! The teachers will be taking the children outside to play to get some fresh air and exercise, whenever possible. (The exception would be when the temperatures are below 32 degrees.) Please dress your child with mittens, hats and boots (with snow). Send shoes so the children can change out of their boots. Please label the items! Our "lost and found" grows very quickly!

Safety for our students (and their parents) in Extended Care! When the snow flies, the back of the church will be cleared first. You may park in the handicapped area while you are dropping off your child and you will only be steps away from the door, and there is a light! Also, when driving around back to drop off or pick up children, please follow the driving pattern – come in along the west side of the church and depart by the garage down the shared drive with Genacross, along the east side of the playground. We have had some near collisions at the back corner of the church with cars coming in and going out.

Please continue to be safety conscious with regards to letting others follow you into the building. The building houses the church offices so people come and go for many different reasons. Some of the church members have keycards, but others do not. When the church or school office lets people through the door, then we know who is on the premises. We are doing all we can to keep both the children and the staff safe.

If you have a change of address, phone numbers or email, please inform the school office or your child's teacher. If your child were to get sick, we would like to be able to contact you quickly.

School Website

We are trying to keep our website (<u>www.firststjohndayschool.org</u>) current so you can find information there. Monthly School and teacher newsletters and calendars are posted for your convenience. It bothers the children when they come to school and are not prepared for special activities. Keep that calendar handy till the end of the month. School Forms are also available on the website.
