Flu Shots

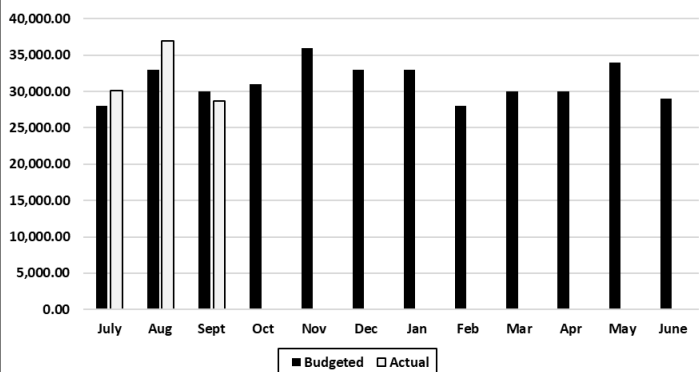

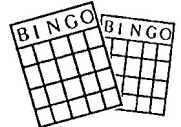
