Schoolhouse Workshops-August 2020



QUILTS for the COMMUNITY 2019 REPORT

The First Friday, Lighthouse and Rainbow Quilters donated a total of 251 quilts in 2019!

2 Women's Resource Center

16 NICU, All Saints, Racine

17 St. Monica's Home, Racine

8 Children's Hospital, Milwaukee

62 Camp Serenity in Tomahawk WI

- 60 Racine Foster Children
- 20 Wounded Warrior Quilts includes 10 to Union Grove Veteran's Hospital

263 TOTAL GIVEN out in 2019 which includes 12 left from 2018

Southport Quilters from Kenosha gave us 30 quilts to go to Camp Serenity which brought the total to 92. They ask for 80 each year and we will again try to get close to this number. The extra quilts are used as needed for the children. The estimated total of 251 given quilts is over \$90,000!!! This total includes fabric used and time served! Pretty amazing!! The needs for 2020 are Racine Foster Kids Program, Camp Serenity, Wounded Warriors and local veterans needs so keep making quilts in sizes 36 x 36 to 60 x 70!



An art quilt is an original exploration of a concept or idea rather than the handing down of a pattern. It experiments with textile manipulation, color, texture and/or a diversity of mixed media.
