PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

L'shanah tovah! It feels so good to have the KJCC family back together, safe and sound. The high holidays have arrived at an opportune time and provided a respite

from this storm season and what a season it was. Dennis, Katrina, Rita I am glad to report our members were only minimally impacted. The physical plant of the KJCC withstood the storms.

Did you know in Hebrew, Rosh Hashanah literally means "head of the year" or "first of the year"? Although Rosh Hashanah is commonly known as the Jewish New Year, this reference is somewhat deceptive because there is little similarity between Rosh Hashanah, one of the holiest days of the year, and the secular New Year. But there is one important similarity between the Jewish New Year and the American one: Many Americans use the New Year as a time to make resolutions. Likewise, the Jewish New Year is a time to begin introspection, looking back at the mistakes of the past year and planning the changes to make in the new year.

The celebration of Rosh Hashanah is a happy day marked with solemnity, as it is the day on which the whole world is judged for the coming year. Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the world. It was on this day that G-d created Man on the 6th day of creation. Every year, on this day, we proclaim G-d as our one and true King.

The ten days beginning with Rosh Hashana and ending with Yom Kippur is a time of serious introspection, a time to consider our sins of the past year and repent. We recognize G-d's sovereignty and atone for our sins with G-d. We also seek reconciliation with people we may have wronged during the course of the year. The Talmud maintains that Yom Kippur atones only for sins between man and G-d. To atone for sins against another person, we must first seek reconciliation with that person, righting the wrongs we committed against them if possible.

The essential opportunity of Rosh Hashanah is to clarify for ourselves what our truest, "bottom line" priorities are in life. No time is more appropriate for asking ourselves some basic questions in order to clarify—and remind ourselves—what is truly important to us and who we ultimately want to be. So I would like to share with you some questions excerpted from the Rosh Hashana Yom Kippur Survival Kit to reflect on:







CARROT-APPLE CASSEROLE

5 carrots 2 T flour 1 cup orange juice 6 T brown sugar 5 macintosh apples butter or margarine

Grease a 2 guart casserole. Slice carrots and boil until soft, not mushy. Mix sugar and flour. Thinly slice one apple directly into the casserole to cover the bottom. Cover with 1/5 of the carrots. Sprinkle some of the flour mixture on top of carrots. Continue to fill casserole with layers of apples, carrots and flour mixture until casserole is filled. Slowly pour orange juice over the top of casserole contents. Sprinkle top with some sugar and dot with butter or margarine. Bake at 350° for 1/2 hour.

Try these carrot recipes for some sweetness in your New Year!!

GOLDEN CARROTS

2 lbs carrots, peeled and sliced	1/2 cup orange juice
2 T brown sugar	1 T flour
1 t lemon juice	1/4 cup butter

1/4 cup fresh parsley, chopped (or 1 T dried) 1/4 cup almonds, finely chopped

Cook carrots in water until crisp tender. (may also be steamed) Drain. In large saucepan, combine remaining ingredients, except parsley and almonds. Stir until lumps disappear and cook over medium heat. Add carrots and parsley and toss. Top with almonds just before serving.

	CARROT PUDDING
1 cup shortening	1 egg
1 1/4 cups flour	1 t salt
1 t baking powder	1/2 cup brown sugar
1 1/4 cups grated raw carrots	1/2 T baking soda
juice and rind of 1/2 lemon	-

Cream shortening and sugar. Mix the egg, carrots, lemon juice and rind. Sift dry ingredients together and add to carrot mixture. Bake in greased baking dish at 375° for 30-45 minutes.
