No funding was recommended for Substance Abuse Outpatient Care in FY19. This priority will be revisited in the next PSRA cycle. At the December Ryan White conference, inquiries will be made as to what other EMAs are doing to fund vision services.

Priorities are ranked based on need in the region. However, the highest priorities don't necessarily receive the highest amount of funding. Other funding streams may be available.
