THINKING INSIDE THE BOX

or

How good maintenance, once again, saved the world...

The Three Principles to Live By:

- 1-Get everything working the way it should be and keep it there
- 2-Satisfy the Customer
- 3-Save Energy

CLUE: if you do the first one, two and three will take care of themselves.

GET SMART! The best person for the job is never the one who is only book-smart or the guy who learned everything he knows from only hands-on. Crack the books and stick your head above the ceiling.

KNOW THY BUILDING. Take the time needed to learn all about your building. You should have a thorough knowledge of not just how the HVAC system works (all components, the various sequence of operations, etc), but also plumbing, fire systems (what does the Fire Alarm Control Panel actually do in the event of an alarm?), elevators (have you tested your fire recall lately?), building envelope (roof, walls, doors, windows), electrical and lighting, construction standards, codes, insurance requirements, etc, etc. Does anyone see a pattern here?

THOU SHALT DO THY MORNING ROUNDS. Just like brushing your teeth and getting dressed, Thy Morning Rounds should be the first thing on your list of to do's every day. If you absolutely have to, try to do a short version utilizing the Rule of Two's (for Chiller, Cooling Tower, AHU, Chemical Station, etc.). CAUTION: Avoid Thy Morning Rounds at your peril! Nothing like a good pair of eyes.

SWEAT THE SMALL STUFF. Keep an eye out for little things...they have a tendency to grow. Fix 'em as you find 'em or put them on the schedule. Remember the **costs squared rule** for putting things off!

THE PIT BULL DOES NOT LET GO. If there are things wrong in your building, there is ALWAYS A REASON and don't let anyone tell you different! Dig, dig, dig and find the root cause of the problem and fix it or know the reason why! Which brings me to:

DOCTOR, I NEED A SECOND OPINION. You may have only one contractor (for HVAC, electrical, plumbing, etc), and hopefully they are very competent, but THEY ARE NOT GOD and do not know everything. If you have problems that are not going away or concerns that are not being addressed, find help elsewhere.

And lastly, someone who needs no introduction, **MR. PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE** is the Heart and Soul of any program, the Rock that we build upon, the Foundation of The Nation and Job Number One. Treat with utmost respect, if you shortchange then short-term gain equals long-term pain.

We are also trying to move it around the entire city so that EVERYONE has a chance to participate.


This month it will be on the NE side. Last month it was at Furr's Cafeteria on the West side at 151 & 410.
