Inquire about the credentials of the arborist who does diagnostic work, pesticide recommendations and estimates. The tree service should also have climbers

with many years of experience and whom have been certified as ISA Arborists. This combination of education and skill ensures that you will have accurate and correct work done on your job. A skilled climber should also have extensive knowledge of tree pruning. The climbers in your chosen tree service must know how to use spurless techniques while pruning. Climbing spurs can severely injure your trees, leading to infection and death.

Proper arborists should be able to give accurate estimates. Be very suspicious of any business that gives a low estimate. All responsible tree services operate within a similar cost structure. These business will be taking into consideration your needs, the safety of their employees and the type of equipment that is need to do the job right. Additionally, be wary of tree services that only except cash. These business are not to be trusted.

Finally, choose a service that will be around next year and is willing to carry out plans to maintain your trees. Cheaper business typically do poor quality work and end up not making it in the long run.
