





Sunday, after one last look at Grady's collection of Harleys, Indians and Whizzers, we said our good byes and then had a really enjoyable ride home.


Every year I look forward to this weekend to just plain kick back and relax. This year couldn't have been nicer.



Trailer". Note - Peter Heintz claimed that his nonfairing Indian had a flat - sure everyone believed him?


