This Day in History:

- 3/2 Monday: On this day in 1807 congress abolished the African slave trade. The African slave trade began in 1619 and lasted 188 years and in these 188 years around 12.5 million people were shipped to the new world but only around 10.7 million of those people survived the journey. The practice of slavery would last for another 58 years.
- 3/3 Tuesday: On this day in 1820 congress passed the Missouri compromise. This bill temporarily resolved tensions between slavery and antislavery by making Missouri a slave state under the condition that the rest of the Louisiana purchase above the 36th parallel and thus preserving the balance between the northern states and the southern states.



- 3/4 Wednesday: On this day in 1789 the first session of congress under the U.S. constitution began. It was held in New York City, and of the 22 senators and 59 representatives called to represent the 11 states that had ratified the constitution. Only 9 senators and 13 representatives showed up. Just 7 months after this meeting began congress adopted the bill of rights to the constitution.
- 3/5 Thursday: On this day in 1913 Woodrow Wilson was inaugurated as the 28th president of the United States. He ran on a campaign called New Freedom which stressed individualism and states' rights, and during his first term he helped pass a large amount of progressive reforms and when he ran again he won narrowly on the slogan "He kept us out of war". America would eventually join the war in 1917.
- 3/6 Friday: On this day in 1951 the trial of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg began. They were the first American civilians to be executed for conspiracy to commit espionage and the first to suffer that penalty during peacetime. They were found guilty of giving Atomic secrets to the Soviet Union.
