Well as I was gathering my things to leave and walk down the hall to the elevator Mr. Clark yelled out for help said he couldn't breath, so I went in his room and ask how can I help you Mr. Clark he said again I can't breath and he showed me his stomach it was bleeding and I went to get the nurse who was still on duty which was

she said OK then went into the room 5-10 minutes later in the meantime me

I did an EKG on him put his Oxygen bag on took his Blood pressure and Temperature checked his pulse ox and Blood sugar told the nurse she told me to tell the nurse that was coming on shift next because she was off duty at the time past on I told her she went to see about him so I did another EKG on him again page Dr. G he called back instantly asked what's wrong and I told him and he hung up I went back into the room told Mrs. Mr. Clark I called the Dr. and I attended to Mr. Clark I grab the crash cart Mr. Clark told me please do not let him die please and I made it my duty as a

PCA to do just that until the D.O.s. came because Mr. Clark started getting worse not better even when my shift was over I still stayed and attended to Mr. Clark because I did not like what say I made sure everyone and everything was by his side until he made it to the ICU. What I did like is that

I left him and went home didn't help and then called back and said she forgot to give him his medication right in the middle of Mr. Clark coding it was wrong very unprofessional and unacceptable period. Harper Hospital knows it yes someone needs to answer to it.
